
Driver Training


These improvements will improve the working environment for the staff and our image with regard to our customers. Once the new Computer is fully operational, the existing computer room will be turned over to more beneficial use.


In the 1600 class Bob Mayfield slaughtered the opposition while Caterham 7 drivers Richard Hough





Ken Lifford has sold his Morry Minor-a sad day indeed.


