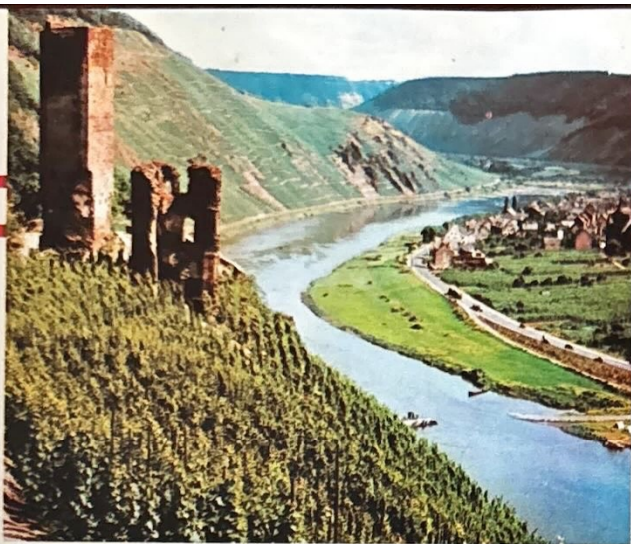

Dutch Bulb Fields, Amsterdam and Brussels (3 days) £25.00

Departure:- Friday, 4th May.

Friday Dover for 1130 Townsend ferry to Zeebrugge (lunch obtainable on board), Brugge (tea stop in picturesque city which was once the leading commercial centre in Western Europe), Antwerp, Breda, Rotterdam (two nights in a city and seaport which was largely rebuilt after a German air assault in 1940).

Saturday Delft (famous china industry), The Hague (administrative capital), Amsterdam (three hours lunch stop and opportunity to go on a canal cruise, visit the Reich Museum and go shopping in Holland's largest city), Haarlem, Keukenhof Gardens (magnificent display of tulips, narcissi, hyacinths and many smaller bulbs in a beautiful 66-acre park), Madurodam (tea stop by the world's most famous model village), Rotterdam.

Sunday Optional excursion to the Euromast (450-foot tower overlooking Rotterdam Harbour). Brussels (two hours lunch stop in another European capital), Zeebrugge for 1800 ferry to Dover, return Epsom area soon after midnight.

Included in the fare:- Cross-Channel fares, two nights dinner, bed and breakfast and admission to the Keukenhof Gardens.

Conditions of Booking

- 1 Children's fares.** Children under three years old may travel free, providing they do not occupy seats. Persons between the ages of three and thirteen may travel at half fare except where stated, to the nearest 5p above, and when a tour includes an additional service requiring a special quotation.
- 2 Dogs.** These animals are carried only at the discretion of the driver, to whom a payment of 25p should be made, this sum being refunded if the dog causes any annoyance and the owner asked to remove the offending animal from the coach.
- 3 Push-chairs and invalid chairs.** Passengers are asked to mention such articles at the time of booking. Owing to the chance of damage to other luggage and shortage of space, it is regretted that push-chairs and invalid-chairs cannot be conveyed on Saturday express services.
- 4 Luggage.** One suit-case or similar article may be carried per passenger free of charge but only on the understanding that it is taken at owner's risk. Additional articles may be transported at an extra charge of 10p each, this amount being payable to the driver.
- 5 Personal luggage.** Smaller articles may be placed on the racks provided in the coach on the understanding that the Company will not be liable for any injury or damage caused by such articles, or their loss.
- 6 Lost property.** Under the Public Service Vehicle Regulations a fee has to be paid for any lost property which is recorded in the Company's Register, and subsequently claimed from the Lost Property Office. This fee will comprise an administration charge and a reward (relative to the value), to the finder of the article.
- 7 Sound reproduction.** The playing of radios, record-players, tape-recorders and musical instruments is prohibited.
- 8 Seat numbers.** In the case of clerical errors, or where it has been necessary to substitute a coach with different numbers, no liability can be accepted for passengers having to sit on seats which differ from those indicated on the ticket.
- 9 Inclusive arrangements.** The Company reserves the right not to be liable for loss, injury, delays or inconvenience caused where inclusive arrangements have been made with other firms.
- 10 Stops.** At stops, passengers are advised to co-operate by returning to the coach by the time specified by the driver, as no liability will be accepted for passengers having to be left behind.
- 11 Cancellation of bookings.** In the event of illness preventing travel and immediate prior notice being given, a refund will be made on the production of a doctor's certificate, being the full fare less ten per cent booking fee. Refunds will not be considered for any other reason, although passengers may deposit their tickets for re-sale, on the understanding that they will only be resold when that particular service has been fully booked and that ten per cent administration charge will be payable. Failing a re-sale, the ticket may be deposited as credit against another booking.
- 12 Cancellation of scheduled services.** All services are operated under Road Service Licenses which are subject to the approval of the Commissioners. The need to vary routes and times arises from time to time and passengers are advised to have their names and addresses written on their tickets to avoid any inconvenience, the Company not being responsible beyond the value of the ticket issued.
- 13 H. R. Richmond Limited reserves the right to alter or cancel any part of the services quoted in this programme, although every attempt will be made to adhere to what is advertised.**
- 14 Licenses have not been granted for some of the services advertised in this brochure and are subject to the approval of the Traffic Commissioners.**
- 15 Fares.** The fares published in this programme are subject to further Government legislation.
