A delightful tour, visiting a beautiful cluster of islands which have a mild climate and a charm that is unforgettable. **Monday** Making convenient stops for refreshment, we drive direct to Penzance and board a British Airways helicopter for the short flight to St Mary's (one of two flights one hour apart). A bus conveys us to the hotel which is situated in a quiet location at the edge of Hight Town, the island capital. **Tuesday to Thursday** You have time to explore St Mary's and the other islands which are steeped in history and a paradise for wild flowers. The hotel is within easy walking distance of the shops, beaches and quay where launches make daily trips to Treas and other world famous tropical islands. St Martin's, St Agnes, Bryher and other islands. Sea birds abound, and poppies, dogfish and seals are common. **Friday** After breakfast, we return to the airport for the flight back to Penzance (one of two flights one hour apart). Making convenient stops for coffee, lunch and tea, we arrive home at approximately 3 p.m. We stay at the **Hotel Goodwin, St Mary's** (telephone 0720 22316), a large granite building on level ground near the harbour, every bedroom with private facilities, colour TV and tea/coffee making facilities. AA 3-star.

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## Discovering Cornwall's Atlantic Coast

8 days £235 ● Single room £260

**A leisurely touring holiday**, stopping in the pleasant seaside resort of Bude and visiting many interesting local attractions. **First day** Making convenient stops for coffee, lunch and tea, we arrive early evening in Bude. **Sunday to Friday** During our stay, we visit the following: *Bottom Moor* We follow the main road viewing the moor's highest points which tower like mountains on the horizon. *Bozcastle* The small village has an intricate little harbour, flanked by formidable cliffs. *Coveville* The picturesque old-world coast village clings to wooded cliffs. Narrow cobble streets drop steeply between whitewashed cottages to a small harbour. *Great Torrington* Perched on a steep hill above the River Torrington, the town occupies one of the finest sites in Devon. There are many interesting old buildings and the little market square has considerable charm. We also include a visit to Dartington Glassworks, *Lanhydrock* (National Trust, admission extra). Situated near Bodmin, the 17th century house epitomises the solid comfort of the late Victorian age. The park is particularly beautiful and there are also fine gardens. *Lanreoston* The hilly market town still retains its old-world character. We also include a visit to nearby Yarnacca Inn, made famous in *Daphne du Maurier's* book, *Passerow House and Gardens* (admission extra). The Georgian mansion is set in a large formal garden and contains a fine collection of 18th century paintings. *Port Isaac* State-hung cottages line the steep, traffic-free streets which run down to the fishing port. *Trange* Set on a wild stretch of the Atlantic coast, the town is famous for its legends of King Arthur. The ruins



Bude

Known as King Arthur's Castle, stand 300 feet above the sea on a rocky promontory. **Last day** We return along a different route making convenient stops for coffee, lunch and tea and arriving home approximately 9 p.m. **Bude** has fine sandy beaches and magnificent coastal scenery combining the assets of a true "holiday town" with a quieter beauty that pervades Cornwall. We stay at the **Strand Hotel, Bude** (telephone 0288 3222), a modern well-appointed hotel overlooking the sea; lift, every bedroom with private facilities, colour TV and tea/coffee making facilities; AA 3-star.

**A leisurely tour**, stopping in the dignified South Devon coastal resort of Sidmouth. **First day** Stopping for coffee in the historic Cathedral City of Winchester, we continue via the New Forest to the ancient stone-bull town of Dorchester for lunch. We go on via Bridport to Lyme Regis which has pretty colour-washed cottages and wonderful cliff scenery, arriving late afternoon in Sidmouth. **Second day** The morning is free in the quiet resort of Sidmouth which is flanked by red and white cliffs and sheltered between two tree-covered hills. In the afternoon, we go on a tour of Dartmoor National Park, famous for its rugged and desolate beauty. **A leisurely touring holiday**, stopping in the lively coastal resort of Torquay and visiting many interesting local attractions. **Sunday** We stop for lunch in the beautiful stone-built town of Sherborne, and arrive early evening in Torquay. **Monday to Friday** During our stay we visit the following: *Exhiam* There are two picturesque parts of Exhiam - the old village clinging a hill and the fishing harbour 'fall-a-mille below'. *Buckfast Abbey* The Abbey was built by Benedictine monks and completed in 1538. A lovely stop (not always open), you can buy locally wine and honey. *Dartmeet* The most famous beauty spot in Dartmoor is where the East and West Dart rivers meet. Flooring lists are sent to hotels at least four weeks before departure. If you wish to make a late booking, you will have to pay the usual deposit before we contact the hotel(s). The deposit will be refunded should we be unsuccessful obtaining the accommodation.

**4. Amendments**  
Once a booking has been made and deposit paid, an amendment fee of £5.00 per person (maximum £10.00 per booking) will be charged in all cases where the client requests a change of tour or departure date (must be in the same year). Where changes are requested within the normal six week balance payment period, we will treat the original booking as cancelled and you will have to pay the usual cancellation fees.

**5. Cancellation by Passenger**  
Cancellations should be communicated in writing to Epsom Coaches. If you cancel before six weeks of departure, you will lose your deposit. Cancellations within six weeks of departure will be subject to the following charges -

25-28 days - 30% of the total cost  
14-25 days - 45% of the total cost

**7. Alterations**  
Should material alterations to arrangements become necessary, we will notify you immediately and give you the choice of accepting the alternative which must be of comparable standard, if available, or of receiving a prompt and full refund of all money paid (less reasonable expenses when an alteration is due to circumstances amounting to a force majeure).

**8. Children's Reductions**  
Our children under three cannot be accommodated on tours. Subject to their sharing a bedroom with at least two adults, children over three under 12 will be offered a 20% reduction on the usual cost. Most of the tours involve long distances and are not ideally suited to young children.

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Prices in this brochure are per person and based on costs, fuel charges, currency, and exchange rates, tariff rates and taxes, including VAT (current at the time of going to press (1st September 1985)). Should costs fluctuate, the right is reserved to increase or decrease prices up to the date when the balance becomes due.

**10. Picking Up Points**  
The locations of the picking up points are given on page four. Your choice of picking up point must be advised to us at the time of booking and you will always be set down where you were picked up. If you decide to pick up at another authorised point, you must send us a written notification at least two weeks before departure.

**11. Times**  
Passengers should arrive at their respective departure points at least five minutes prior to the scheduled time of departure. The Company will not be responsible for any loss or additional expense suffered by a passenger who arrives at a departure point later than the scheduled time of departure.

Everyone is kindly asked to be punctual when on tour. We have to run to schedule and cannot be held responsible for anyone being late.

The return times are only approximate and meant as a guide for passengers' convenience. If someone is meeting you, you are advised to confirm the return time with the driver and telephone from the last stop.

**12. Luggage**  
Because space is limited, luggage must not exceed one medium-sized suitcase per person plus light hand luggage. The labels provided by the Company should be clearly filled in and securely attached to your luggage to avoid misdirection.

**13. Seat Numbers**  
We reserve the right to allocate seat numbers other than those allocated at the time of booking, although this will be avoided so far as possible. It is essential that passengers only sit in the smoking section of the coach.

**14. Offence or Incompatible Conduct**  
The Company reserves the right to decline any booking and to require any passenger to withdraw from a tour if it deems that his/her actions or conduct are offensive or incompatible with the general comfort of other passengers. In this event all monies paid by the passengers for services not taken would be refunded.

**15. Animals**  
Animals cannot be carried on any tour advertised in this brochure (except guide dogs on British tours only).

**16. Radios, Tape Players, Musical Instruments etc.**  
In the interest of other passengers, radios, tape players, musical instruments etc. cannot be played.

**17. Passports, Visas, Vaccinations etc.**  
Passports should be applied for, or renewed if necessary, at least six weeks before departure. Passports travelling alone must have their own passport. Please remember to have your passport readily available as you may be required to present it when crossing international frontiers. Holders of Commonwealth or other passports should check Visa regulations with the Consulates of the countries to be visited.

Vaccinations are not normally required by UK residents for tours to Europe. However, from time to time any country may impose special regulations and you are advised to consult your doctor or travel agent for up to date details of requirements.

The Company will not be responsible or liable for any delay or expense suffered by passengers whose passports are not in order at the time of travel or who have neglected to deal with health and visa requirements.

**18. Excursion Documents**  
If you are a British subject without a passport, you may use an Excursion Document on our two- and three-day tours to France. The Excursion Document is available on personal application from any train Post Office for a fee of £2.50. You will need proof of identity, a passport-size photograph and counter-signatures.

**19. Hotels and Refreshment Stops**  
The AA star ratings are taken from the 1985 Guide.

Because the number of single rooms is always limited, friends are kindly asked to share rooms where possible. Where there are three persons travelling together, it is usually possible to allocate a triple room. Full breakfast is provided except on the Continent where Continental breakfast is usually served. A three- or four-course table d'hôte dinner is provided in the evening. Coffee is usually included and except on the Continent, there is nearly always a choice of menu. We usually stop in a town where you can make your own arrangements for lunch. Unless indicated, morning coffee and afternoon tea are not included. We make convenient stops for these. The hotel service charge is usually included although some hotels leave it to the discretion of clients.

Although we are pleased to pass on any special requests to hotels - e.g. low floor, special diet etc. - we cannot guarantee your requirements will be met.

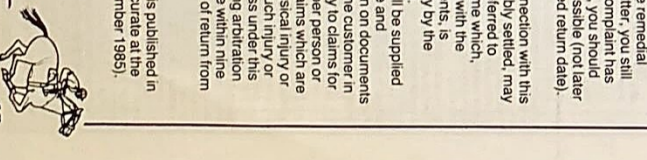
**20. Gratuities to Drivers**  
The driver's gratuity is not included in the cost of a tour. If you have been happy with his service, it is customary to give him a gratuity according to the level of service received.

**21. Complaints**  
Should you have a problem or complaint it is important, and in your own interest, that you notify our driver or local representative immediately so he can try to take remedial action. If he reports the matter, you still remain of the opinion that your complaint has not been satisfactorily dealt with, you should notify us in writing as soon as possible (not later than 28 days after your scheduled return date).

**22. Arbitration**  
Disputes arising out of, or in connection with this contract, which cannot be amicably settled, may (if the customer so wishes) be referred to arbitration under a special Scheme which, though devised by arrangement with the Association of British Travel Agents, is administered quite independently by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators.

The Scheme (details of which will be supplied on request) provides for a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on the customer in respect of costs. It does not apply to claims for an amount greater than £1,000 per person or £5,000 per booking form or to claims which are solely or mainly in respect of physical injury or illness. If you elect to seek redress under this Scheme, written notice requesting arbitration under the Scheme must be made within nine months after the scheduled date of return from the holiday.

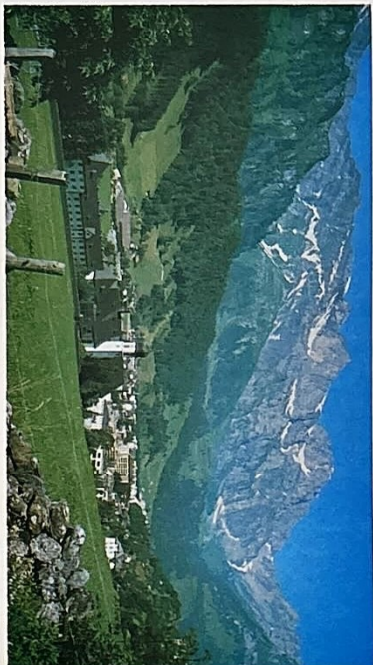

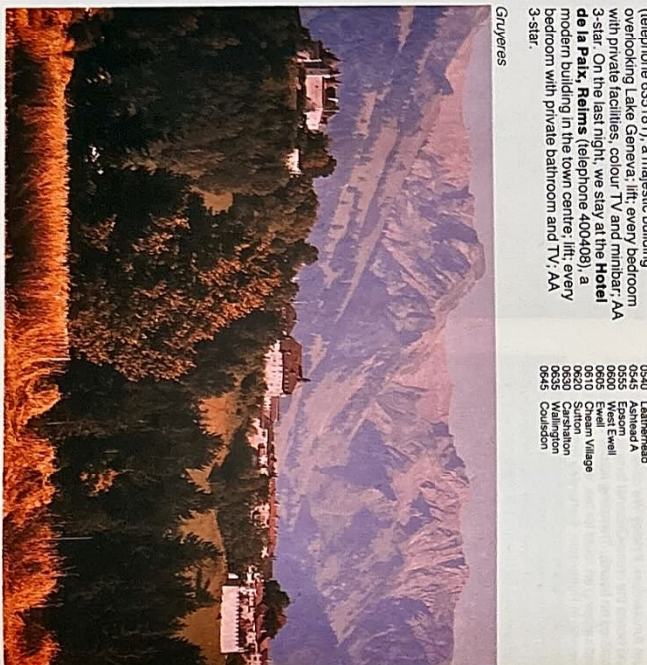

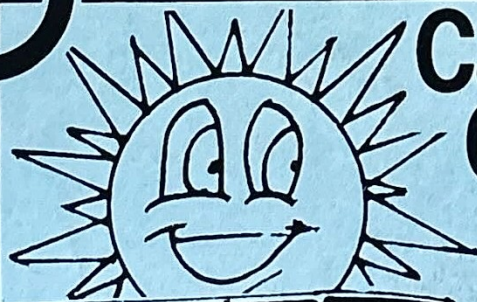
