LOOE Colourful fishing harbour and picturesque resort, at the mouth of the tidal River Looe which flows through a deep wooded valley. East Looe and West Looe are joined by a Victorian bridge. West Looe clusters round the quayside church and a 17th-century inn. Good bathing, river and sea trips.

Hannaford Point Hotel (telephone 01503 263273), in a superb setting in West Looe overlooking the headland and bay; steps to the reception and stairs to the lift; every bedroom with private bathroom, television and tea/coffee making facilities; leisure club with indoor heated swimming pool; AA 3-star.

Your contract is with Epsom Tours Limited (registered in England number 2694843), a member of the Association of British Travel Agents (ABTA number V5291).

1. Your holiday contract When you make a booking you guarantee that you have the authority to accept and do accept on behalf of your party the terms of these booking conditions. A contract will exist as soon as we issue our confirmation invoice. This contract is made on the terms of these booking conditions which are governed by English Law and we both agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the English Courts at all times.

2. Your financial protection We are a member of ABTA, holding ATOL number 4035 issued by the Civil Aviation Authority, which provide for your protection in the event of our insolvency.

3. Your holiday price When you make your booking you must pay a deposit of £30 per person on holidays of up to four days duration and £50 per person on holidays of five days duration and over. The balance of the price of your travel arrangements must be paid at least six weeks before your departure date. If the deposit and/or balance is not paid in time, we shall cancel your travel arrangements. If the balance is not paid in time we shall retain your deposit. All monies you pay to the travel agent are held by him/her on our behalf at all times.

The price of your travel arrangements was calculated using the tourist rates quoted in *The Daily Telegraph* on 19 May 1999 in relation to the following currencies: Austria 20.20, Belgium 59.241, France 9.6337, Germany 2.8723, Holland 3.2359, Ireland 1.1562, Italy 2.843 and Spain 244.35.

The price of your travel arrangements is subject to surcharges for increases in transportation costs such as fuel, scheduled air fares and any other airline surcharges which are part of the contract between airlines (and their agents) and the tour operator or organiser. Also government action such as increases in VAT or any other Government imposed increases and currency changes in relation to an adverse currency exchange rate variation.

Even in this case, we will absorb an amount up to 2% of the price of your travel arrangements, which excludes insurance premiums and any amendment charges. Only amounts in excess of this 2% will be surcharged, where you have to pay a surcharge there will be an administration charge of £1 per person together with an amount to cover agents' commission. If this means that you have to pay more than 10% of the price of your travel arrangements, you may cancel your travel arrangements and receive full refund of all monies paid, except for any premium paid to us for holiday insurance and any amendment charges. Should you decide to cancel for this reason, you must exercise your right to do so within 14 days from the issue date printed on your final invoice.

4. If you change your booking If, after our confirmation invoice has been issued, you wish to change your travel arrangements in any way, for example your chosen departure date or accommodation, we will do our utmost to make these changes but it may not always be possible. Any request for changes to be made must be in writing from the person who made the booking or your travel agent. You will be asked to pay an administration charge of £10, and any further cost we incur in

making this alteration. You should be aware that these costs could increase the closer to the departure date that changes are made and you should contact us as soon as possible.

Note: Certain travel arrangements (eg Apex tickets) cannot be changed after a reservation has been made and any alteration request will incur a 100% cancellation charge.

5. If you cancel your holiday You, or any member of your party, may cancel your travel arrangements at any time. Written notification from the person who made the booking or your travel agent on your behalf must be received at our offices. Since we incur costs in cancelling your travel arrangements, you will have to pay the applicable cancellation charges up to the maximum shown in clause 6.

Note: If the reason for your cancellation is covered under the terms of your insurance policy, you may be able to reclaim these charges.

6. If we change or cancel your holiday It is unlikely that we will have to make any changes to your travel arrangements, but we do plan the arrangements many months in advance. Occasionally, we may have to make changes and we reserve the right to do so at any time. Most of these changes will be minor and we will advise you or your travel agent of them at the earliest possible date. We also reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your travel arrangements.

For example, if the minimum number of clients required for a particular travel arrangement is not reached, we may have to cancel it. However, we will not cancel your travel arrangements less than six weeks before your departure date, except for reasons of *force majeure* or failure by you to pay the final balance. If we are unable to provide the booked travel arrangements, you can either have a refund of all monies paid or accept an offer of alternative travel arrangements of comparable standard from us, if available. If it is necessary to cancel your travel arrangements, we will pay to you compensation as set out in this clause.

Please note that carriers such as Airlines used in the brochure may be subject to change. Such a change is deemed to be a minor change. Other examples of

minor changes include alteration of your outward/return flights by less than 12 hours, changes to aircraft type, change of accommodation to another of the same standard.

If we make a major change to your holiday, we will inform you or your travel agent as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before your departure. You will have the choice of either accepting the change of arrangements, accepting an offer of alternative travel arrangements from us if available or cancelling your booked holiday and receiving a full refund of all monies paid. In all cases, except where the major change arises due to reasons of *force majeure*, we will pay compensation per person as indicated in the panel below.

7. If you have a complaint If you have a problem during your holiday, please inform the relevant supplier (eg your hotelier) and our resort representative immediately who will endeavour to put things right. If your complaint is not resolved locally, please follow this up within 28 days of your return home by writing to our Customer Services Department at *Blenheim Road, Epsom, Surrey KT19 9AF* giving your booking reference and all other relevant information. Please keep your letter concise and to the point. This will assist us to quickly identify your concerns and speed up our response to you.

It is strongly suggested that you communicate any complaint to the supplier of the services in question as well as to our representative without delay and complete a report form whilst in resort.

If you fail to follow this simple procedure we will have been deprived of the opportunity to investigate and rectify your complaint whilst you were in resort and this may affect your rights under this contract.

8. What happens to complaints It is unlikely that you will have a complaint that cannot be settled amicably between us. However, disputes to do with this contract which cannot be settled amicably, may (if you wish) be referred to Arbitration under a special scheme which, is arranged by the Association of British Travel Agents, but is administered quite independently by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators.

Force majeure: This means that we will not pay you compensation if we have to cancel or change your travel arrangements in any way because of war, riot, industrial dispute, terrorist activity, natural or nuclear disaster, fire, adverse weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances that may amount to *force majeure*.

The scheme provides for a simple and inexpensive method of Arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on you in respect of costs. The scheme does not apply to claims for any amount greater than £1,500 per person or £7,500 per booking form. Also it does not apply to claims which relate to physical injury or illness. If you choose to proceed to Arbitration under this scheme, you must send a written notice of your decision to ABTA within nine months after your scheduled date of return.

Our liability to you

9 (i) We accept responsibility for ensuring that your travel arrangements, which you book with us, are supplied as described in this brochure. If any part of your travel arrangements are not provided as promised, we will pay you appropriate compensation if this has affected the enjoyment of your travel arrangements. We accept responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of our employees, agents and suppliers except where they lead to death, injury or illness. Our liability in all cases shall be limited to a maximum of three times the cost of your travel arrangements.

9 (ii) We accept responsibility for death, injury or illness caused by the negligent acts and/or omissions of our employees or agents, our suppliers and subcontractors, whilst acting within the scope of, or in the course of their employment in the provision of your travel arrangements. We will accordingly pay to you such damages as might have been awarded in such circumstances under English Law.

9 (iii) In respect of travel by air, sea and rail, and the provision of accommodation our liability will be limited in the manner provided by the relevant international convention. You can ask for copies of these international conventions from our offices at *Blenheim Road, Epsom, Surrey KT19 9AF* (telephone 01372 727821).

10. Personal injury unconnected with your booked travel arrangements If you, or any member of your party, suffer death, illness or injury whilst overseas arising out of an activity which does not form part of your package travel arrangements or an excursion arranged through us, we shall at our discretion, offer advice, guidance and assistance. Where legal action is contemplated and you want our assistance, you must obtain our written consent prior to commencement of proceedings. Our consent will be given subject to your undertaking to assign any costs, benefits received under any relevant insurance policy to ourselves. We limit the cost of our assistance to you or any member of your party to £5,000.

11. Conditions of carriage The Contractual terms of the companies that provide the transportation for your travel arrangements will apply to this contract. These may contain terms which affect your rights to compensation. You may ask for copies of the relevant conditions of carriage from our offices. This brochure is our responsibility, as your tour operator. It is not issued on behalf of, and does not commit the airlines mentioned herein or any airline whose services are used in the course of your travel arrangements.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Animals Animals are not allowed on our tours. The only exception is Guide Dogs, Hearing Dogs and Registered Assistance Dogs on the UK mainland only subject to the agreement of hotels. You will need to advise us at the time of booking and your dog must sit on the coach floor not obstructing passenger access. Clause 25 also applies to dogs and their owners.

2. Children Subject to their sharing a bedroom with two adults, children will be offered a reduced price. Our tours are not suitable for children under five years of age.

3. Consumer levy If a consumer levy is introduced to provide additional financial protection for holidays advertised in this brochure, it will be shown as a separate item on your invoice.

4. Delays Whilst every effort is made to adhere to the times stated in this brochure, occasionally there are circumstances beyond our control such as weather and traffic conditions, which may cause delays. In the event of a delay of more than six hours on the outward or return journey, we will endeavour to provide refreshments/meals and overnight accommodation as appropriate.

5. Disabled persons We offer the same standard of service to all clients including the disabled. Wherever possible, we will accommodate disabled people although we are limited in the assistance we can provide. If you are disabled and wish to book on a particular tour, please write to us giving full details, ensuring your letter is acknowledged. Unless we are advised, we cannot be held responsible for any inconvenience or costs and this may include our refusal to take you on holiday or complete your holiday arrangements. We are pleased to pass on special requests to hotels but cannot guarantee your wishes will be met. See Clause 1 regarding Guide Dogs etc.

6. Fitness to travel Please check with your doctor if in any doubt about your fitness to travel.

7. Foreign currency On European tours, we suggest that you take a small amount of currency for each country visited and the main bulk of your money in travellers cheques which are insured against loss and easily converted into cash. Credit cards are usually accepted on major purchases.

8. Gratuities Gratuities to the driver/courier and hotel staff are not included in the cost of our tours. If you have been happy with the service, it is customary to give a gratuity according to the level of service received.

9. Health requirements At the time of going to press, there were no special health requirements for any of the countries featured in this brochure. If you are travelling on a European tour, you should obtain the leaflet 'Health Advice for Travellers', available from ABTA travel agents or the Department of Health. This contains forms CM1 and E111 enabling you to obtain emergency medical treatment in the EU more easily. Please read carefully and take the completed forms to your Post Office for stamping.

10. Hotels The hotel ratings are for 1999. By 'private facilities' we mean either bath and WC or shower and WC. Some amenities (lifts, swimming pools etc) require servicing or cleaning so we cannot guarantee they will always be available. Meal times may be set and you will usually have to share a table with other guests.

11. Itineraries Schedules are flexible and our tours are not suitable for meeting friends at stops. We may also vary the order of places visited.

12. Late booking If you wish to make a late booking (usually within four weeks of departure), you will need to visit your travel agent or book with us direct using Visa, MasterCard or Switch.

13. Lost property All lost property must be claimed and collected within one month of returning from *Epsom Coaches, Blenheim Road, Epsom, Surrey KT19 9AF* (telephone 01372 723252).

14. Luggage Luggage must not exceed one suitcase per person plus light hand baggage because space is limited. The labels provided by the company should be clearly filled in and securely attached to your luggage to avoid misdirection. It is your responsibility to ensure that your luggage is loaded on to the vehicle on which you are travelling. In the event of loss or damage, you must obtain a signed report from our representative at the time of the incident. This should accompany any correspondence.

15. Mobile telephones Please consider other passengers and keep use of mobile telephones to a minimum. Excessive use is prohibited.

16. No smoking Smoking is prohibited in all sections of the coach. Some hotels also restrict smoking.

17. Passports and visas For European tours (excluding Ireland) you will require a full 10-year British Passport. Please ensure as soon as you have made your booking that you have a valid passport, especially as obtaining a new or replacement British Passport can take up to one month (longer in exceptional circumstances). At the time of going to press, visas were not required by holders of British Passports for countries visited by Epsom Tours. We cannot accept responsibility for any of our clients who are not in possession of the correct travel documents.

18. Picking-up points and times Your choice of picking-up point must be advised to us at the time of booking. Please ensure you are waiting at the right point in plenty of time. We cannot be held responsible for any loss or expense suffered by your late arrival at a picking-up point. Heavy traffic can result in delays so do not leave the picking-up point.

19. Portage Every endeavour will be made to provide portage, except at airports where trolleys are provided. Our tour costs include portage for one

piece of baggage per passenger. Occasionally portage is not available due to circumstances beyond our control.

20. Radios, tape players etc In the interest of other passengers, radios, tape players, musical instruments etc must not be played inside the coach.

21. Refreshment stops Convenient stops are made for coffee, lunch and tea which are not usually included in the cost of our tours.

22. Seat allocation You keep the same seat(s) throughout the tour (including coaches hired from other operators) and since allocations are made on a first come, first served basis, early booking is recommended to maximise choice. The seating plan on the back cover is a guide only and lay outs vary with the toilet and servery at the centre or rear of the coach. We reserve the right to allocate seats other than those you have booked, though this will be avoided so far as possible.

23. Special requests Special requests to hotels - eg low floor or special diet - should be made at the time of booking. We are pleased to pass on requests but cannot guarantee your wishes will be met.

24. Travel documents When you pay your balance, your agent will issue luggage labels. Information packs will usually be distributed when you commence your tour.

25. Unreasonable conduct We reserve the right to refuse a booking or terminate a passenger's holiday in the event of unreasonable conduct. Full cancellation charges will apply and we will be under no obligation for any refund, compensation, loss or additional expenses you may incur.

26. Year 2000 We accept no responsibility for disruption, inconvenience, cancellation or alteration to holidays due to problems caused directly or indirectly by the Year 2000 problem (where computer systems may be unable to cope with dates in 2000) where these problems are not our fault or the fault of one of our suppliers or could not have been avoided even though all reasonable care had been taken.

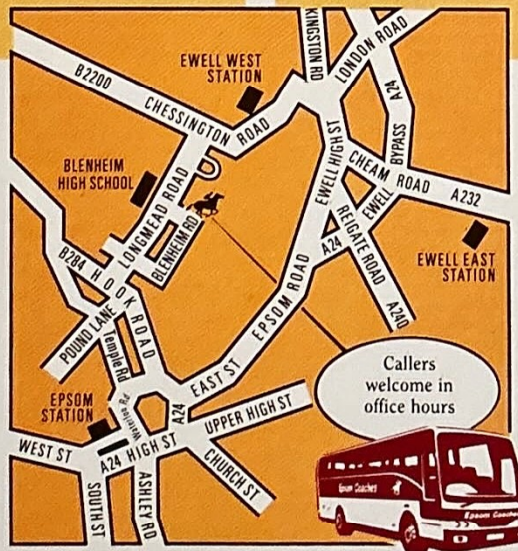
