Friday 0710 C* Epsom. Via Woodstock and the Cotswolds we make another break for lunch at a country inn before reaching the border. We stop in Gretna Green to see the anvil marriage ceremony before the night stop in Dumfries, an attractive county town closely linked with Robert Burns.

Saturday by way of the Lowther Hills we make for Glasgow. Stopping by George Square there are many fine buildings and shops to be seen in the city centre. We pass along the banks of Loch Lomond before crossing over the Pass of Glencoe on our way to the west coast. We approach our base for the next five nights in Fort William, by way of Lochs Leven and Linnhe.

Sunday morning free. There is a short afternoon excursion along Loch Eil.

Monday visiting Inverness we see the best of the river and Loch scenery in the Highlands. En route we see the Aviemore Sports Centre and the commando memorial at Spean Bridge.

Tuesday day excursion to Oban, see the little granite cathedral, the castle ruins and the glassworks. In the afternoon, we follow the coast road, first by climbing the hill to Portland and looking down on the panorama below and then by following the Chesil Bank, a long blue-clay reef covered in shingle, to West Bay for tea. A picturesque fishing resort with red sandstone cliffs and many old cottages. We return via Dorchester and Salisbury to arrive Epsom by 2200.

WINCHESTER SALISBURY & STONEHENGE

Departures: Friday 18th June, Tuesday 27th July and Thursday 2nd September

Epsom 0900 H*. The lunch stop is in Winchester which for centuries was capital of England. The cathedral is the longest Gothic church in Europe and contains famous shrines. In the hall of the Castle is the legendary round table of King Arthur. We continue to Salisbury where we stop for 2 hours again, allowing time to visit the cathedral and stroll by the river Avon. We then drive across Salisbury Plain to Stonehenge, the stones which are up to 21 feet high came from Pembrokeshire over 200 miles away and is regarded as a feat of transportation in its time. The tour returns by 2030.

WOBURN ABBEY/WILD ANIMAL KINGDOM

Adult £2.10; Child £1.30 includes Wild Animal Kingdom, Abbey extra

Departures: Sunday 20th June, Friday 23rd July, Sunday 15th August and Friday 27th August

Epsom 0930 L*. The coach passes through the Wild Animal Kingdom which is the largest drive-through game reserve of its kind outside Africa. There are white rhino, lions, giraffe, oryx, elephants, cheetahs and baboons. The coach stops for refreshments, there is a picnic area. For those passengers wishing to visit the Abbey there are many fine paintings. There is also the Antique Centre, Art Galleries and Pottery, Art & Craft Shop, Pet's Corner and Amusement Park. The coach returns to Epsom by 1930.

The famous naturalist, Gilbert White, who lived in "The Wakes", now a Museum, described the peaceful scene which is evident as soon as you arrive in the village. There is a good view from "The Hanger", a natural habitat for the many birds that make the background chorus. Tea is obtainable in the village, although some time should be allotted to visiting the Church and "The Wakes". A pleasant drive home by way of Hindhead and the Devil's Punch Bowl to arrive Epsom 1915.

KEW GARDENS & SYON PARK

There is an interesting museum and a shop where you can purchase a wide range of slightly substandard glassware at substantially reduced prices. Children under the age of 14 cannot be accommodated. Home approximately 1800.

WINCHESTER & MEON VALLEY

Adult £1.25; Child 65p

Departures: Tuesday 25th May, Tuesday 13th July, Friday 13th August and Sunday 5th September
Epsom 1400 S*. We go to Winchester via the Hog's Back and New Alresford. For centuries Winchester was the capital of England. The cathedral is the longest Gothic church in Europe and contains many famous shrines. In the Great Hall of the Castle is the legendary table of King Arthur. We return by way of some very attractive landscape, with picturesque villages, as far as Petersfield before turning north to Hindhead and returning by the Devil's Punch Bowl, to arrive Epsom at 2030.

WINDSOR

Adult £1.15; Child 60p

Departures: Tuesday 20th July, Wednesday 4th August, Thursday 12th August and Tuesday 24th August
Epsom 1245 O*. Windsor is a historic Thameside town with the largest inhabited castle in the world. The castle is built on a hill overlooking the river and has been the chief residence of English monarchs since William the Conqueror nearly 900 years ago. The precincts are open daily and subject to the absence of the court, so are the State Apartments, Queen's Doll House, St. George's Chapel, Albert Memorial Chapel, the Round Tower and Keep. We return via the Great Park to Epsom by 1915.

WINDSOR SAFARI PARK

Adult £1.60; Child £1.00 inclusive of Safari drive and admission

Departures: Monday 19th April, Sunday 30th May, Sunday 11th July, Saturday 31st July, Tuesday 17th August, Tuesday 24th August, Monday 30th August and Thursday 28th October

Epsom 1245 O*. The coach passes through the animal reserves where lions and cheetahs, gorillas and baboons are roaming free. In the zoo you can walk among llamas, zebras and ostriches and there are aviaries with tropical birds. There is also a monkey jungle and a pet's corner where children can play with animals and have pony rides. At an extra charge you can watch a dolphin display. From the top of the hill you can see Windsor Castle and the Post Office Tower. Home by approximately 1815.

WISLEY GARDENS

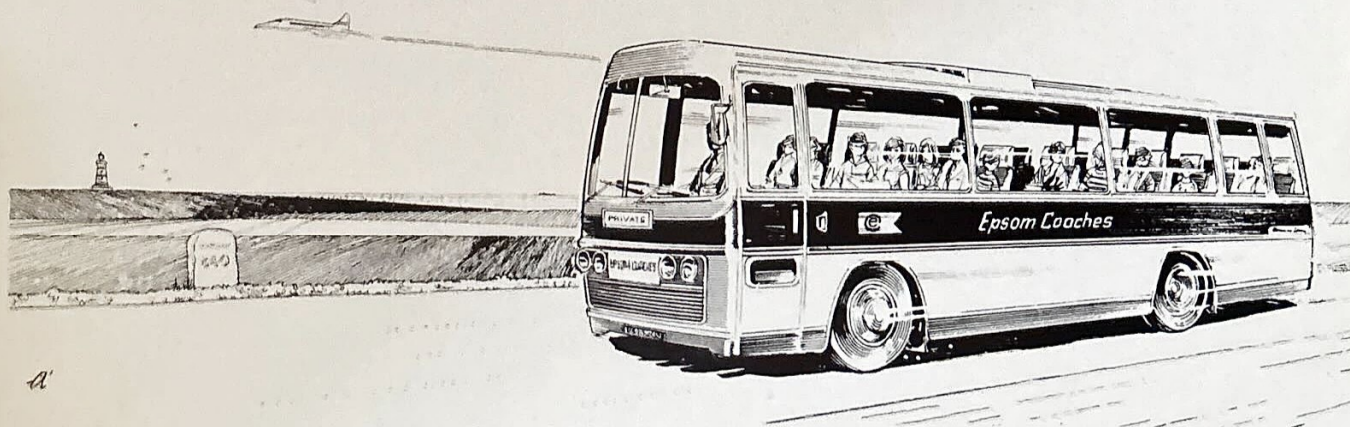
