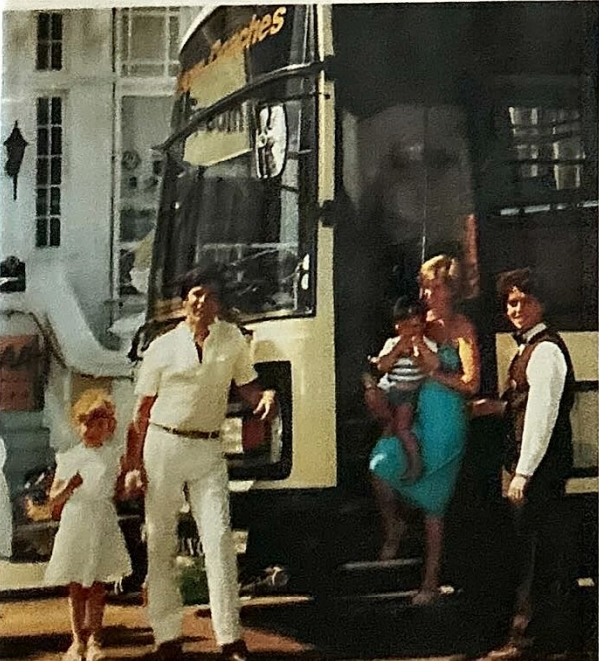
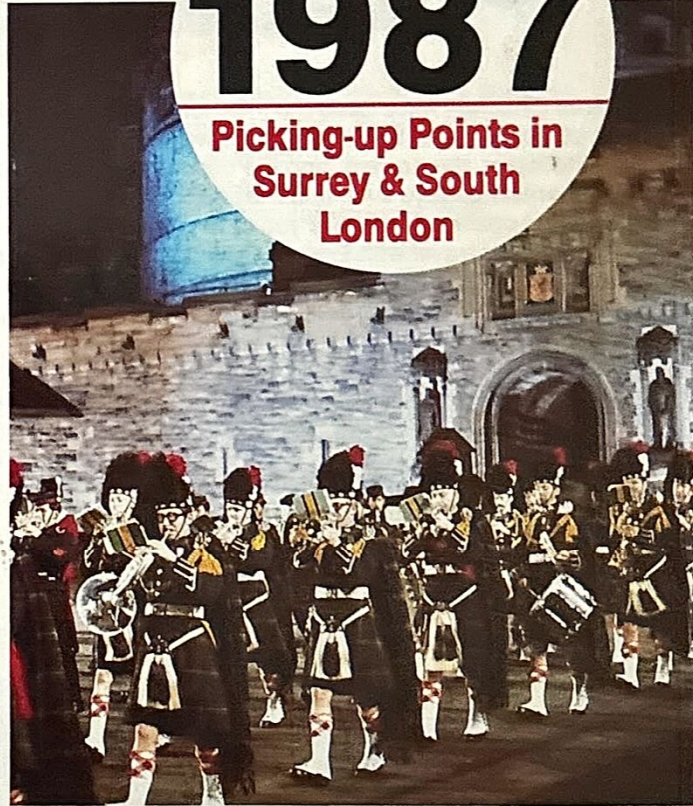
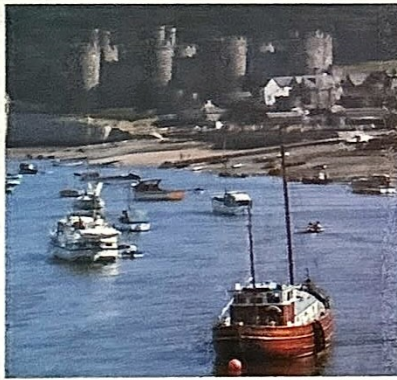

ENGLAND West Country

Isles of Scilly

A delightful five-day tour, visiting a beautiful cluster of islands with a mild climate and charm that is unforgettable.

Monday Making convenient stops for refreshment, we drive direct to Penzance and board a British Airways helicopter for the short flight to St Mary's (one of two flights one hour apart). A bus conveys us to the hotel which is in a quiet location at the edge of Hugh Town, the island capital.

Tuesday to Thursday You have time to explore St Mary's and the other islands which are steeped in history and a paradise for wild flowers. The hotel is within easy walking distance of the shops, beaches and quay, where launches make daily trips to Tresco with its world famous tropical gardens. St Martin's, St Agnes, Bryher and other islands. Sea birds abound and porpoises, dolphins and seals are common.

Friday After breakfast, we return to the heliport for the flight back to Penzance (one of two flights one hour apart). We make convenient stops for coffee, lunch and tea.

Tresco

Cornish Riviera

A magnificent five-day tour, visiting a beautiful area where an exceptionally mild climate allows sub-tropical flowers and trees to flourish.

Tuesday making convenient stops for coffee, lunch and tea, we arrive early evening in Falmouth.

Wednesday The morning is free in the lovely resort of Falmouth where a natural harbour winds inland among beechwoods, and narrow streets and alleys climb from the quayside to the terraces. Later there is a leisurely excursion to St Mawes, an enchanting little resort with colour-washed cottages and a sheltered harbour.

Thursday We stop for coffee in the ancient town of Truro which is dominated by a beautiful cathedral. Next we visit Newquay which is built on the clifftops of Cornwall's Atlantic coast, above an old harbour and 10 interlinked bays of golden sand.

Friday A visit is made to the Lizard, the southernmost part of England, where a majestically beautiful coast, with soaring cliffs and pinnacles of rock stretches down to Lizard Point. Later we visit the colourful Cornish fishing

port of St Ives, popular with artists and fishermen with its labyrinth of narrow twisting streets, cobbled passages, archways and cottages.

Saturday We return along another pleasant route, stopping for coffee, lunch and tea. Home at approximately 8 p.m.

Falmouth Beach Hotel, Falmouth (telephone 0326 318084), a modern building overlooking the Cornish coast and only 10 minutes walk from the town centre; lift; every bedroom with private facilities, colour TV and tea/coffee making facilities.

5. Our price guarantee

The prices in this brochure are guaranteed, and there will be no surcharge arising from currency fluctuation, fuel increases or any normal cost increases. Only governmental action can alter this guarantee and in such case you can either continue with your booking at the new price or cancel with a full refund. The brochure prices are based on the Financial Times World Value of the Pound Table of 29th July 1986.

6. Alterations by us

In the unlikely event of our having to make a significant change to your holiday, we will inform you or your travel agent as soon as possible. A major change is defined as:

- (i) An alteration to your scheduled time of departure or return of six hours or more or a reduction of time in your resort of six hours or more;
 - (ii) A significant change of resort;
 - (iii) A change of hotel to a lower star rating.
- If a major change becomes necessary, you can either:
- a) accept the alternative offered;
 - b) rebook on another available holiday;
 - c) cancel your booking and receive a full and prompt refund.

Whichever choice you make we will compensate you on the scale below:

The compensation payments do not apply to changes caused by hostilities, political unrest or circumstances amounting to force majeure.

7. Cancellation by us

If we have to cancel a holiday, you will be notified at least six weeks before departure. We will only cancel within six weeks as a result of hostilities, political unrest or other circumstances amounting to force majeure. You will be notified immediately of a cancellation and offered the choice of a prompt refund of all money paid or an alternative holiday of at least comparable standard if available.

8. Complaints

Should you have a complaint about any aspect of our holiday, you must notify our driver/courier immediately, so that he/she can try to resolve the problem. If having reported the matter, you still remain of the opinion that your complaint has not been satisfactorily dealt with, you should notify us in writing within 28 days of your return.

9. Arbitration

Disputes arising out of, or in connection with this contract, which cannot be amicably settled, may (if you so wish) be referred to arbitration under a special Scheme which, though devised by arrangement with the Association of British Travel Agents, is administered quite independently by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. The Scheme (details of which will be supplied on request) provides for a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on you in respect of costs. It does not apply to claims for an amount greater than £1,000 per person or £5,000 per booking form or to claims which are solely or mainly in respect of physical injury or illness or the consequences of such injury or illness. If you elect to seek redress under this Scheme, written notice requesting arbitration under the Scheme must be made within nine months after the scheduled date of return from the holiday. The Scheme does not apply to claims which are mainly in respect of physical injury or illness.

11. Conditions of Carriage

12. Our liability to you

However, we have no direct control over the provision of such services to you by those suppliers and do not have or accept any liability for the actions or omissions of them or of any persons employed by them who are not our servants or agents. If you find you have any dispute with such persons, we will give you such reasonable help as we can in resolving this.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Children's discounts

Subject to their sharing a bedroom with two full fare paying passengers, children over three years of age and under twelve, will be offered a 20% discount on the usual cost.

Departure and return times

You should arrive at your picking up point at least five minutes prior to the scheduled time of departure and are responsible for being at the correct point at the correct time. We cannot be liable for any loss or expense suffered by clients because of their late arrival at any departure point. The return times are only approximate and if you are being met, you are advised to confirm the estimated return time with the driver and telephone from the last stop.

Disabled persons

If you are disabled or infirm, please advise us at the time of booking.

Fitness to travel

Please check with your doctor if in any doubt about your fitness to travel.

Foreign currency

On Continental tours, we suggest that you take a small amount of currency for each country visited, and the main bulk of your money in travellers cheques, which are insured against loss and easily converted to cash.

Gratuities to drivers

The driver's gratuity is not included in the cost of our holidays. If you have been happy with his service, it is customary to give him a gratuity according to the level of service received.

Group bookings

Groups are allowed one free place in 20. If you have 30 persons or more, we can arrange a special coach.

Hotels

The AA ratings are taken from 1986 guides. Dinners are usually three courses and include coffee, and on UK holidays there is a choice of menu. Please refer to the holiday descriptions for the type of breakfasts offered. Hotel service charges are included in the cost of our holidays.

Insurance

We include the cost of holiday insurance in all our holidays. Full details of the protection offered by our policy are shown on page 38 and you are covered from the time you pay your deposit.

Late bookings

Rooming lists are sent to hotels at least four weeks before departure. If you wish to make a late booking, you will have to pay the usual deposit before we contact the hotel(s). The deposit will be returned, should we be unsuccessful obtaining the accommodation.

Luggage

Because space is limited, luggage must not exceed one medium-sized suitcase per person plus light hand luggage. The labels provided by the company should be clearly filled in and securely attached to your luggage to avoid misdirection. We do not accept responsibility for loss or damage to luggage unless it is proven that it is due to our negligence, but the insurance cover included in the holiday price provides assistance in the event of such a claim.

Passports and visas

We will not be responsible or liable for any delay or expense suffered by passengers whose passports are not in order at the time of travel or who have neglected to deal with health and visa requirements.

Pets

You may not bring a pet or any other animal on our holidays (guide dogs excepted).

Picking-up points

Your choice of picking-up point must be advised to us at the time of booking. If you decide to pick up at another authorised point, you must send us a written notification at least two weeks before departure.

Radios, tape players etc

In the interest of other passengers, radios, tape players, musical instruments etc. cannot be played on the coach.

Refreshment stops

Convenient stops are made for morning coffee, lunch and afternoon tea which are not included in the cost of our holidays (unless specified).

Seat allocation

You keep the same seats throughout your holiday and since allocations are made on a first come, first served basis, early booking is advisable to give you a better chance of getting the seats you want. We reserve the right to allocate seats other than those you have booked, though this will be avoided as far as possible.

Smoking

It is essential that passengers refrain from smoking in the 'No Smoking' section of the coach. Pipe and cigar smoking is prohibited.

Special requests

Although we are pleased to pass on special requests to hotels - e.g. low floor or special diet - we cannot guarantee your wishes will be met.

Travel documents

When you pay your balance, your agent will give you a balance ticket and luggage labels. An information pack will be given to you by your driver/courier when you commence your holiday.

Unreasonable conduct

We can refuse a booking, or terminate a passenger's holiday in the event of unreasonable conduct.

HOLIDAY INSURANCE

You are advised to detach this page and keep it with your travel documents.

We have arranged a special Holiday Insurance scheme through Perry, Gamble & Co. Ltd. underwritten by the Norman Insurance Co. Ltd. and cover is provided for any person who has paid the appropriate premium. Your deposit ticket is evidence of your being insured which will need to be provided in the event of a claim. This is a synopsis of the cover and the full insurance wording may be inspected at our office on request.

DEFINITIONS

Insured Person: Any person who has paid the required premium which is included in the deposit.

Period of Insurance: In respect of Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 the date of departure from normal place of residence within the United Kingdom not being more than 24 hours prior to the date of departure of outbound conveyance or the date of commencement of cover shown on the ticket whichever occurs last to the date of return to the same address or the date of expiry of cover shown on the ticket whichever occurs first.

In respect of Section 1 from the date of payment of premium to the date of return to normal place of residence or to the date of expiry of cover shown on the ticket whichever occurs first.

Section 1 - CANCELLATION UP TO HOLIDAY COST

Loss of irrecoverable deposits or charges paid in advance or contracted to be paid for the benefit of the Insured Person only in the event of necessary cancellation arising from:

- The death injury illness or pregnancy occurring after insurance has been effected of the Insured Person or any person with whom the Insured Person has planned to travel.
- The death serious injury or serious illness of any relative of the Insured Person or close business associate or person with whom the Insured Person has planned to travel.
- The Insured person or any person with whom the Insured person has planned to travel being subject to jury service attendance under subpoena as a witness at a Court of Law compulsory quarantine or being made redundant and qualifying for payment under the current Redundancy Act(s).
- The prevention of travel to the intended destination by Government restriction following an epidemic occurring before the commencement of the journey.

Section 2 - CURTAILMENT UP TO HOLIDAY COST

Proportional return of the irrecoverable pre-paid expenses of the planned holiday and additional reasonable travelling expenses following curtailment of the holiday by the return of the Insured Person to his permanent domicile or place of residence in the United Kingdom unavoidably necessitated by:

- The death serious injury or serious illness (occurring during the period of the holiday) of the Insured Person or any person with whom the Insured Person is travelling or any relative or close business associate of such person.
- The hi-jack of the conveyance in which the Insured Person is travelling.

Section 3(a) - Medical and Other Expenses up to £25,000 Europe only

- Medical hospital and treatment expenses (including cost of EMERGENCY dental treatment only) incurred as a result of the injury or illness of the Insured Person
- Reasonable additional accommodation costs incurred outside the United Kingdom beyond the holiday period originally booked and additional travel costs to the United Kingdom necessarily and unavoidably incurred by:
 - the Insured Person
 - a relative or friend required on medical advice to travel and/or remain with the Insured Person as a result of death serious injury or serious illness of the Insured Person
- In the event of death of the Insured Person reasonable charges for burial or cremation in the locality where death occurs and/or the cost of transport of body or ashes to the United Kingdom for an amount not exceeding £1,000.

Section 3(b) - Repatriation Expenses - UK only

To pay up to £200 in all each injured or sick Insured person in respect of the emergency repatriation of the Insured person to his or her domicile in the UK in the event of bodily injury or illness of a. the Insured Person or b. the person with whom the Insured Person is travelling or has arranged to travel or c. the spouse, parent, parent-in-law, grandparent, child, grandchild, brother, sister or close business colleague being resident in the United Kingdom of the Insured person or the person with whom the Insured Person is travelling.

Section 4 - HOSPITAL BENEFIT UP TO £200

If the Insured Person is admitted to a hospital outside the United Kingdom as an in-patient due to accidental bodily injury or illness sustained outside the United Kingdom the Company will pay benefit of £10 for each complete 24 hours the Insured Person is in hospital subject to a maximum of the Limit of Liability for each Insured Person.

Sections 3 & 4 Exclude

- Treatment or aid obtained in the United Kingdom
- Surgery or medical treatment which in the opinion of the medical practitioner treating the Insured Person can be reasonably delayed until the Insured Person's return to the United Kingdom.
- The additional cost of single or private room accommodation at a hospital or nursing home except where the medical practitioner treating the Insured person deems it necessary for the Insured Person to occupy such accommodation.

Section 5 - PERSONAL ACCIDENT - Benefit £5,000

If the Insured Person shall sustain accidental bodily injury caused by violent external and visible means or by exposure resulting from accident to an aircraft or vessel or conveyance in which the Insured Person is travelling and such injury shall solely and independently of any other cause result within twelve calendar months of the date of the accident in Death or Disablement as herein defined the Company will pay the following benefits:

Death or Loss of one or more eyes or limbs } The Benefit stated above
Permanent Total Disablement

Permanent Total Disablement means total disablement from engaging in or attending to any occupation for at least twelve months from the date of injury and at the end of that time being beyond hope of any improvement.

In no event shall the Company's Liability in respect of any Insured Person exceed the Benefit.

Section 6 - BAGGAGE AND PERSONAL EFFECTS - Limit Each Insured Person £600

- The Company will indemnify the Insured Person in the event of loss of or damage to baggage taken sent in advance or purchased on the holiday or journey (including clothing and personal effects worn or carried on the person trunks suitcases and like receptacles)

- In the event of baggage being lost for longer than twelve hours by misdirection in delivery to destination the Company will pay up to £50 for the purchase of essential items of clothing or personal requisites any payments under this heading will be deducted from claims under Section 6 in respect of the same property.

 - From any unattended motor vehicle
 - Whilst in transit from baggage not in the custody or control of an Insured Person
 - Of travellers cheques not immediately reported to the local branch or agent of the issuing authority.

Section 8 - PERSONAL LIABILITY UP TO £250,000

Accidents happening during the Period of Insurance resulting in claims being made upon the Insured person as a private individual for:

- bodily injury illness or disease to any person not being a member of the Insured Person's family or household nor at the time of the accident engaged in the service of the Insured Person
 - loss or damage to property not belonging to or in the charge of or under the control of the Insured Person or of a member of his household or of a person in his service
- The amount payable in respect of any one accident or series of accidents constituting one occurrence shall not exceed the Limit of Indemnity in addition to costs and expenses incurred with the consent of the Company.

Section 9 - TRAVEL DELAY - Limit of Liability (a) £60 (b) Holiday Cost

If the departure from the United Kingdom of the aircraft or sea vessel in which the Insured Person had arranged to travel is delayed for at least twelve hours from the time specified in the official itinerary supplied to the Insured Person due to strike/industrial action adverse weather conditions or mechanical breakdown of the aircraft or sea vessel the Company will pay either:

- £20 for the first full twelve hours delay and £10 for each full twelve hours delay thereafter (the delay being calculated from the departure time of the aircraft or sea vessel specified in the official itinerary) up to Limit of Liability (a) each Insured Person

- Irrecoverable deposits or charges paid in advance or contracted to be paid for the benefit of the Insured Person only in the event of cancellation of the holiday/trip up to the Limit of Liability (b) each Insured Person

N.B. A claim cannot be made under both (a) and (b) or under Section 9 and Section 1.

EXCLUDING CLAIMS

- Arising if the Insured Person fails to:

 - Obtain written confirmation from the carriers (or their handling agents) of the number of hours delay and the reason for such delay
- Arising from strike or industrial action existing or notified by intention at the date this insurance is purchased by the Insured Person.

CONDITIONS

Claims Procedure and Requirements

- On the happening of any illness injury or loss or damage the Insured shall at his own expense:

No property may be abandoned to the Company

OTHER INSURANCE

REASONABLE PRECAUTIONS

- Section 5 Personal Accident Benefit £1,000
- Section 4 Hospital Benefit cancelled
