Isles of Scilly

6 days visiting a beautiful cluster of islands which have a mild climate and charm that is unforgettable

Day 1 At Penzance board the helicopter to St Mary's (one of two flights one hour apart). Transfer to the hotel, quietly located at the edge of Hugh Town, the island capital.

Days 2 to 5 Plenty of free time to explore St Mary's and the other islands which are steeped in history and a paradise for wild flowers. The hotel is within easy walking distance of the shops, beaches and quay, where launches make trips to Treco with its world-famous tropical gardens and other islands. 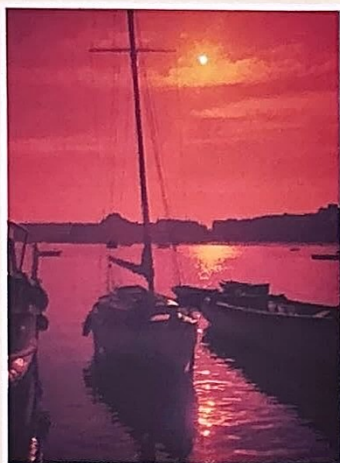

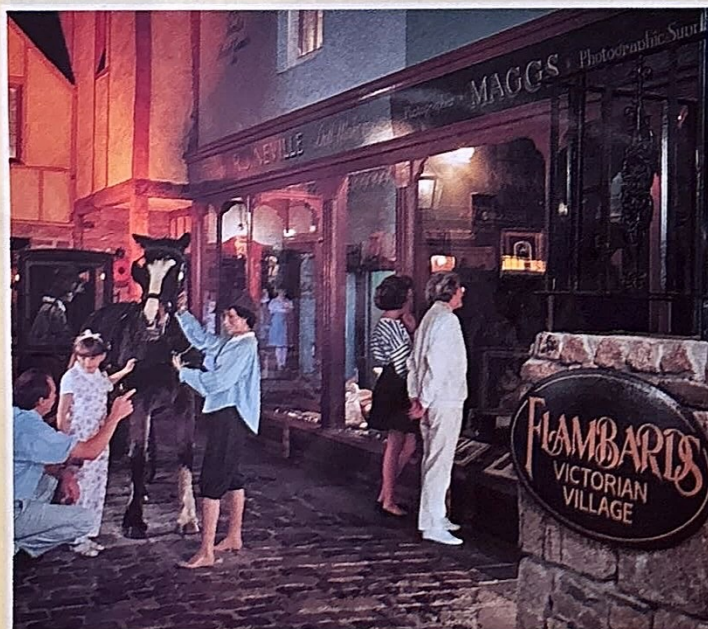

6 days stopping in Newquay on Cornwall's Atlantic coast; visits to St Mawes, Padstow, Tintagel, Lanhedock and St Ives

Sunday A pleasant route to Cornwall, arriving early evening in Newquay.

Monday Morning free in Newquay, built on cliff-tops above an old harbour and ten inter-linked bays of golden sand. Afternoon excursion to St Mawes, an enchanting little resort on the Roseland Peninsula with colour-washed cottages.

Devon and Cornwall

5 days stopping in the historic seaport of Plymouth; visits to Saltram, Looe, Polperro and Dartmouth

Tuesday Stop for lunch in the mellow stone-built town of Sherborne and arrive late afternoon in Plymouth.

Wednesday Morning at leisure in Plymouth. Afternoon excursion to Saltram (National Trust, admission extra), a great neo-classical house set in peaceful surroundings overlooking Plymouth Sound.

Thursday Stop in Looe, a colourful fishing port at the mouth of the tidal River Looe. Also Polperro with its lime-washed houses, narrow streets and small harbour.

Friday Visit Dartmouth, an ancient port with great seafaring traditions. Situated at the mouth of the Dart, the loveliest of Devon's rivers.

Saturday Scenic drive across Dartmoor National Park to the historic cathedral city of Exeter for lunch.

Average return time 7 pm.

Plymouth See the Barbican, a picturesque area of narrow streets, Elizabethan houses and fishing quays - where the 'Mayflower' sailed to America in 1620. Important note: Compensation will not be payable if we are forced to cancel, or in any way change your holiday due to war, threat of war, riot, civil strife, industrial dispute, terrorist activity, natural or nuclear disaster, fire or adverse weather conditions.

8. Cancellation by us We reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your holiday. However, in no case will we cancel your holiday less than six weeks before the scheduled departure date except for reasons of force majeure or failure on your part to pay the final balance. In circumstances where we are unable to provide the holiday booked, we will return to you all monies paid, or offer you an alternative holiday of comparable standard and if a cancellation occurs within six weeks of departure, compensation on a similar scale to that shown in paragraph 7 above.

9. Our responsibility on foreign holidays We accept responsibility for ensuring the holiday which you book with us is supplied as described in this brochure and the services offered reach a reasonable standard. If any part is not provided as promised, we will pay you appropriate compensation if this has affected the enjoyment of your holiday. We accept responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of our employees, agents and suppliers save where they lead to death, injury or illness except as provided in Clause 10 below.

10. We accept responsibility for death, injury or illness caused by the negligent acts and/or omissions of our employees or agents together with our suppliers and sub-contractors whilst acting within the scope of, or in the course of their employment. We will accordingly pay to our clients such damages as might have been claimed in respect of death, illness or injury caused by the negligence, as accepted under English Law, of our employees, agents or suppliers contracted or sub-contracted by us to provide any part of the arrangements for your holiday.

11. If any client suffers death, illness or injury whilst overseas arising out of activity which does not form part of the foreign inclusive holiday arrangement or excursion arranged through us, we shall, at our discretion offer advice, guidance and assistance to help you in resolving any claim you may have against a third party, provided we are advised of the incident within 90 days of the occurrence. Where legal action is contemplated our authority must be obtained prior to the commencement of proceedings and be subject to your undertaking to assign any costs recovered or any benefits received under an appropriate insurance policy to ourselves. Our costs in respect of the above on behalf of you and your party shall not exceed £5,000 in total.

12. In respect of the services provided by air, sea or land carriers, our liability in all cases shall be limited in the manner provided by international conventions.

13. When you travel with the carrier, the conditions of carriage of that carrier apply, some of which may limit or exclude liability. This brochure is the responsibility of the tour operator, it is not issued on behalf of, and does not commit the airlines mentioned therein or any airline whose services are used in the course of the tour.

14. This contract is made on the terms of these booking conditions which are governed by English Law and both parties shall submit the jurisdiction of the English Courts at all times.

General Information

Children's reductions Subject to their sharing a bedroom with two adults, children under 12 years of age will be offered a 20% discount on the usual cost. Our tours are not suitable for children under three years of age.

Disabled persons If you are disabled or infirm, please advise us at the time of booking. Unfortunately, we are limited in the assistance we can provide.

Driver's Gratuity The driver's gratuity is not included in the cost of the tour. If you have been happy with his service, it is customary to give him a gratuity according to the level of service received.

Fitness to travel Please check with your doctor if in any doubt about your fitness to travel.

Foreign currency On overseas tours, we suggest that you take a small amount of currency for each country visited and the main bulk of your money in travellers cheques which are insured against loss and easily converted to cash.

Group bookings Groups are allowed one free place in 20. If you have 30 persons or more, we can arrange a special coach.

Health requirements For information pertaining to health requirements of countries visited by Epsom Coaches, please refer to the DHSS leaflets SA40 and SA41 (Travellers Guide to Health), available from ABTA travel agents or the Department of Health and Social Security. You should also check with your doctor before your departure as to which inoculations the Department of Health consider necessary for specific areas.

Hotels The AA ratings are taken from 1990 guides. Dinners usually include three courses with coffee and UK hotels offer a choice of menu. Please refer to the tour descriptions for the

type of breakfasts offered. Where applicable, hotel service charges are included in the cost of our tours. However, if you have been especially pleased with the service, it is customary to give a gratuity.

Insurance Holiday insurance is included in the cost of our tours. Full details of the protection offered by the policy are shown on pages 38 and 39 and you are covered from the time you pay your deposit.

Late bookings If you wish to make a late booking, you will have to pay the usual deposit before we contact the hotel(s). The deposit will be returned, should we be unsuccessful obtaining the accommodation.

Luggage Because space is limited, luggage must not exceed one suitcase per person plus light hand baggage. The labels provided by the Company should be clearly filled in and securely attached to your luggage to avoid misdirection.

No smoking It is essential that passengers refrain from smoking in all sections of the coach.

Passports and visas We will not be responsible or liable for any delay or expense suffered by passengers whose passports are not in order at the time of travel or who have neglected to deal with health and visa requirements.

Pets Pets and other animals are not allowed on our tours (guide dogs excepted, UK mainland only).

Picking-up points and times Your choice of picking-up point must be advised to us at the time of booking. If you decide to pick up at another authorised point, you must send us a written notification at least two weeks before departure. Please ensure you are waiting at the right picking-up point in plenty of time. We cannot be responsible for any loss or

expense suffered by clients because of their late arrival at a picking-up point.

Radios, tape-players etc In the interest of other passengers, radios, tape-players, musical instruments etc cannot be played in the coach.

Refreshment stops Convenient stops are made for morning coffee, lunch and afternoon tea which are not included in the cost of our tours, unless specified.

Return times By 'average return time' we mean in normal conditions at the middle of the setting down route. If you are being met, you are advised to confirm the estimated return time with the driver and telephone from the last stop. There are taxi ranks outside Epsom and Surbiton stations (adjacent to our setting down points) and Viceroy Car Hire offer a 24-hour service - telephone Epsom (0372) 722222/728007.

Seat allocation You keep the same seat(s) throughout your tour and since allocations are made on a first come, first served basis, early booking is advisable to give you a better choice. We reserve the right to allocate seats other than those you have booked, although this will be avoided as far as possible.

Special requests Although we are pleased to pass on special requests to hotels - eg low floor or special diet - we cannot guarantee your wishes will be met.

Travel documents When you pay your balance, your agent will issue a balance ticket and luggage labels. An information pack will be given to you by your driver/courier when you commence your tour.

Unreasonable conduct We can refuse a booking, or terminate a passenger's holiday in the event of unreasonable conduct.

Holiday Insurance

For residents of the United Kingdom only (including the Channel Islands and Isle of Man).

A Master Policy has been arranged for Epsom Coaches by Perry Gamble & Co Ltd., effected with The Travellers' Insurance Association Limited (referred to herein as 'the Company') and insuring (unless specified to the contrary) each passenger (referred to herein as the 'Person-Insured') whose name is entered on the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt issued by Epsom Coaches.

Important

- This insurance is subject to the terms and conditions of Master Policy No. PX500645 a copy of which is available from the offices of Perry Gamble & Co Ltd., Tuiton House, 27-37 St. Georges Road, Wimbledon, London, SW19 4XE.
- Cover provided by the Master Policy is shown below.
- Cover relating to Cancellation prior to commencement of the holiday under Section 4 commences from the date of issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt. Subsequent cancellation of the Insurance and return of the premium is not therefore possible. For all other Insured Contingencies cover commences from the date of the Person-Insured's holiday or journey as shown on the Confirmation of Booking issued by the Policy holder until the date of completion thereof.

Area 1 Great Britain, N. Ireland and Isle of Man.

Area 2A Channel Islands.

Area 2B Europe, Eire, Russia (West of the Ural Mountains), Mediterranean Islands, Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Turkey, Canary Islands and Madeira.

Area 3 Worldwide.

In consideration of the Premium for each Person-Insured named in the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt and subject to the terms exceptions and conditions of the Policy the Company agrees that in the event of the contingencies described hereafter happening in the Geographical Area for which the Premium has been paid during the period of the holiday or journey the Company will

- by payment or at its option by reinstatement or repair indemnify the Person-Insured against loss or damage as defined in Sections 1 & 2,
- reimburse the Person-Insured or his legal personal representatives medical and other expenses as defined in Section 3,
- pay to the Person-Insured or his legal personal representatives cancellation or curtailment charges as defined in Section 4,
- pay to the Person-Insured or his legal personal representatives the amount stated in Section 5 for bodily injury sustained by the Person-Insured,
- indemnify the Person-Insured or his legal personal representatives against all sums which the Person-Insured shall become legally liable to pay as defined in Section 6,
- pay to or reimburse the Person-Insured or his legal personal representatives either the amounts stated or his charges as defined in Section 7,

provided that the liability of the Company shall not exceed the Sums insured for each Section for each Person-Insured. If because of death, injury or illness of the Person-Insured or anyone who is travelling with the Person-Insured or because of delay or interruption of public transport services the Person-Insured is unable to complete the holiday or journey before the expiry of the Period then the Insurance will be automatically extended without additional Premium for such additional days as may be reasonably necessary for the completion of the holiday or journey.

Section 1 - Personal Luggage - Areas 1, 2A and 2B - up to £600, Area 3 - up to £1,000.

- the contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Person-Insured's Luggage comprising suitcases, trunks and their contents and articles worn or carried plus travel tickets all whilst away from the Person-Insured's usual residence.
- the contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Person-Insured's passport whilst away from the Person-Insured's usual residence during the Period when an amount will be paid to cover the necessary costs incurred in replacing the passport.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or damage incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under paragraph a) of this Section.

Section 2 - Personal Money - Areas 1, 2A and 2B - up to £200, Area 3 - up to £300.

The contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Personal Money (comprising bank and currency notes, cash, cheques, postal and money orders, current postage stamps and travellers' cheques) held for private purposes of the Person-Insured whilst away from the Person-Insured's usual residence. The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or damage incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under this Section.

Section 3 - Medical and Other Expenses

The contingency of bodily injury or illness sustained by the Person-Insured which shall be the sole and direct cause of any of the following necessarily incurred expenses payable within six months of the incident giving rise to a claim.

- (Areas 2A, 2B and 3 only) - up to £500,000
 - reasonable medical, surgical, hospital or nursing home or nursing fees or charges or charges for reasonable emergency dental treatment for the alleviation of sudden pain (which shall not include the provision of dentures artificial teeth or any dental work involving the use of precious material) incurred outside the Person-Insured's country of domicile.
 - reasonable additional transport and accommodation expenses incurred by or for the Person-Insured and any one other person who is required on medical advice to travel to or remain with the Person-Insured.
 - reasonable charges in the event of death for (a) burial or cremation of the Person-Insured in the locality (other than the United Kingdom) where death occurs up to a limit of £1,500 plus the cost of conveyance of the ashes of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom, or (b) conveyance of the body of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom.
 - the Person-Insured being confined to hospital as an in-patient during the period of the holiday when the Company will pay £10 for each full day so confined to a maximum of £200 in addition to expenses under A i) above.
- (Area 1 only) - up to £1,000
 - reasonable additional board or lodging or similar expenses incurred by the Person-Insured or by a relative or friend remaining with the Person-Insured and the increased cost of return travel of the Person-Insured and reasonable additional travel charges by a relative or friend travelling to or with the Person-Insured up to a limit of £500 in total,
 - reasonable charges in the event of death for the cost of conveyance of the body or ashes of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom, Channel Islands or the Isle of Man up to a limit of £500.

If at any time of any claim under this Section there shall be any other Insurance or Indemnity covering the same contingency and any part thereof the Company shall not be liable for more than its rateable proportion thereof.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any expenses incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under this Section.

Incidents that could give rise to a claim in excess of £10,000 must be reported to Europ Assistance immediately using either of the methods shown overleaf.

Section 4 - Cancellation or Curtailment Charges - up to The Final Invoiced Cost of the Holiday.

The contingency of loss of personal accommodation or transport charges and additional travel expenses of the Person-Insured paid or contracted to be paid for the benefit of such Person-Insured only, which are irrecoverable from any other source following necessary:-

- cancellation before the holiday or journey arising from any fortuitous cause outside the control of the Person-Insured occurring after the date of issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt.
- curtailment (cutting short) after commencement of the holiday or journey arising from the return of the Person-Insured to the British Isles or confined to hospital during the period of holiday or travel (certified as necessary), consequent upon:-
 - death, injury or illness of Person-Insured
 - close business associate resident in the United Kingdom of the Person-Insured
 - friend with whom the Person-Insured is travelling spouse, grandparent, parent, parent-in-law, brother, sister, fiancé(e), child, grandchild or other dependant relative of the Person-Insured or of the friend with whom the Person-Insured is travelling, or
 - death, injury or illness of a relative or friend resident abroad with whom the Person-Insured is intending to stay, or
 - the Person-Insured or a friend with whom the Person-Insured is travelling being required for Jury service or as a witness in a Court of Law, or
 - the Person-Insured's presence being required by the Police following burglary, serious fire, storm or flood damage at his home or usual place of business in the United Kingdom.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 (£5 for deposit claims only) of any loss, charges or expenses incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under this Section.

Section 5 - Personal Accident - up to £5,000

The contingency of bodily injury sustained by the Person-Insured caused solely by violent accidental external and visible means which injury shall independently of any other cause be the sole cause of

- death £5,000
 - total and permanent loss of sight in one or both eyes or total loss by physical severance or total and permanent loss of use of one or both hands or feet £5,000
 - permanent and total disablement from engaging in employments or occupations of any and every kind £5,000
- occurring within one year of the happening of bodily injury as aforesaid. Notwithstanding the amount shown for a) b) c) above so far as concerns the Person-Insured whose age is under sixteen years or is seventy-six years or over the Sum Insured shall not exceed £500 for item a). For the Person-Insured whose age is seventy-six years or over no amount shall be payable for item c).

Section 6 - Personal Liability - up to £1,000,000

The contingency of claims made upon the Person-Insured for A. all sums which the Person-Insured shall become legally liable to pay for compensation and claimant's costs and expenses in respect of injury illness disease loss or damage, B. all costs and expenses of litigation incurred with the written consent of the Company in respect of a claim against the Person-Insured for compensation to which the indemnity expressed in this Section applies, in respect of

- bodily injury to or illness or disease of any person not being at the time of sustaining such injury illness or disease, engaged in the service of the Person-Insured.
- loss of or damage to property not belonging to nor in the charge nor under the control of the Person-Insured or a member of his family or a person in his service.

occurring during the period of the holiday or journey.

Section 7 - Departure Delay - up to The Final Invoiced Cost of the Holiday.

Geographical Area 1 (Christmas and New Year tours only), 2A, 2B & 3.

In the event of the contingency of industrial action, adverse weather conditions, mechanical breakdown or derangement of the coach or sea vessel resulting in delayed departure of the Person-Insured's coach or sailing for at least 12 hours on the outward or return journey from the time shown in the Carrier's travel itinerary as supplied to the Person-Insured, the Company will pay to the Person-Insured

- £20 for the first full 12 hours delay, and £10 for each subsequent full 12 hours delay, of such coach journey or sailing per Person-Insured, but not exceeding a total of £60 per Person-Insured or
- that proportion of the invoiced cost of the holiday or journey paid (or contracted to be paid) prior to commencement thereof, for the benefit of such Person-Insured only, which is irrecoverable from any other source, consequent upon abandonment of the holiday or journey by the Person-Insured before departure of the outward conveyance from the United Kingdom, but not exceeding in total Final Invoiced Cost of the holiday.

The delay period shall be calculated from the scheduled departure time of the coach or sailing shown in the travel itinerary and in respect of coach journeys will apply only at the prime starting point of the outward or return journey. Provided always that (1) the Person-Insured shall have checked-in according to the itinerary given to him by the Tour Operator or Carrier and shall have obtained written confirmation from the Coach Operator or Shipping Line or their Handling Agents that the coach or sailing was delayed by a contingency described in the Section (such confirmation stating the actual period of the delay).

Geographical Areas 2A, 2B and 3 only

c) Provided no claim is made under a) or b) above the Company will pay up to £300 for additional accommodation and transport charges as a result of failure of Public Transport Scheduled Services to get the Person-Insured to the coach starting point or departure port by the time stated in the itinerary supplied caused by any contingency stated above.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or charges incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under b) above.

General Conditions (Applying to All Sections)

- It is a condition of this Policy that the Person-Insured has been permanently residing in the United Kingdom for a minimum 12 months period prior to the date of application of this insurance.
- In respect of the same Person-Insured the Company shall not be liable for the same contingency under more than one Travel Policy relating to the same Period issued by the Commercial Union Assurance Company plc or the Travellers' Insurance Association Ltd.
- If any fraud under this Policy shall be in any respect fraudulent or if any fraudulent means or devices are used by the Person-Insured or anyone acting on his behalf to obtain any benefit under this Policy all benefit hereunder shall be forfeited.
- Notice of any claim or of any event which may give rise to a claim under this Policy must be given to the Company as soon as reasonably possible. No property may be abandoned to the Company. All certificates, accounts, receipts, information and evidence required by the Company shall be furnished in such form as the Company may require and at the expense of the claimant.
- The Confirmation and Deposit Receipt must be produced before a claim can be admitted.
- No alteration and or addition to the printed terms and conditions of this brochure shall be valid unless initialled at the Head Office of the Company.
- Any Person-Insured who has received treatment as an in-patient in the six months preceding the holiday booking or is awaiting such treatment must have sought medical advice on the advisability of taking the proposed holiday or journey.
- It is warranted that the Person-Insured is not travelling contrary to medical advice or specifically to obtain medical treatment.
- It is warranted that the Person-Insured has not received a terminal prognosis from a Medical Practitioner prior to the date of issue of this Policy.
- The due observance and fulfilment of the terms provisions conditions and endorsements of this Policy in so far as they relate to anything to be done or complied with by the Person-Insured shall be conditions precedent to any liability of the Company to make any payment under this Policy.
- If payment is made for cancellation of a holiday or journey all other benefits provided by this Policy shall be forfeited.
- No refund of premium will be made after issue of this insurance.
- The Person-Insured shall observe ordinary and proper care for the safety of the property insured and shall give notice within 24 hours of the discovery to the Police at a police station of any loss or theft or to the Carriers when loss or damage has occurred in transit and in either case a report must be obtained.
- The Company shall be entitled to undertake in the name and on behalf of the Person-Insured the absolute conduct, control and settlement of any proceedings at its own expense and for its own benefit but in the name of the Person-Insured to recover compensation or secure indemnity from any third party in respect of anything covered by this Policy.



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Additional Conditions Applying to Section 6 only

- a) No admission of liability or offer promise or payment shall be made without the Company's written consent.
- b) The Company may pay to the Person-Insured the maximum sum payable under this Section in respect of any occurrence or any lesser sum for which the claim or claims arising from such occurrence can be settled and the Company will not be under any further liability in respect of that occurrence except for the payment of costs and expenses of litigation incurred prior to such payment.

General Exceptions — All Sections

The Company shall not be liable for

- 1) any consequence of war, invasion, act of foreign enemy, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection or military or usurped power.
- 2) Winter Sports unless the appropriate additional premium has been paid.
- 3) any claim arising directly or indirectly from any injury, illness, death, loss, expense or other liability attributable to HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) and/or any HIV related illness including AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) however caused and/or any mutant derivatives, variations or treatment thereof however caused.

Other Exceptions —

The Company shall not be liable for the following in respect of the Sections indicated.

Section 1

- a) loss of or damage to watches, jewellery, furs, precious metals, precious stones or articles composed of any of them, photographic apparatus, binoculars, audio and video equipment for more than £150 in respect of the whole of such property for each Person-Insured.
- b) damage or deterioration occasioned by atmospheric or climatic conditions of wear and tear or depreciation.
- c) breakage of or damage to fragile articles, audio and video equipment, musical instruments, sculpture, household goods or equipment unless occasioned by fire or accident to the conveyance in which the Person-Insured's Luggage is being carried.
- d) loss or damage to contact and corneal lenses, bonds, coupons, stamps, negotiable instruments, securities or documents of any kind and Personal Money.
- e) more than £200 in respect of any single article of any kind.
- f) damage to perishable goods or bottles or any subsequent damage caused as a result thereof.
- g) loss or damage to pedal cycles other than whilst being conveyed by Public Transport.
- h) loss or damage to property more specifically insured elsewhere.

Section 2
 depreciation in value or shortage due to error or omission.

Sections 1 & 2

- a) loss or damage to property left unattended whilst away from the Person-Insured's personal accommodation.
- b) any claim for loss of property not accompanied by a report from the local Police or from the Carriers when loss has occurred in transit.
- c) loss or damage arising from strike, delay, confiscation, detention, requisition or destruction by Customs or other Officials or Authorities.

Section 3

the cost of replenishing supplies of any medication the Person-Insured was using at the commencement of the holiday or journey.

Section 4

- a) civil commotion, strike, riot and lock-out, prohibitive regulation by the government of any country, or threat of any such event.
- b) default of any transport or accommodation provider or their agents (including failure of the Person-Insured's own vehicle) or any person acting as agent or conference organiser of the Person-Insured or operation of law.
- c) financial circumstances other than as a result of redundancy under the terms of any Redundancy Payment Legislation (notice of which is received after the issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt) disinclination to travel or weather conditions other than severe weather in the United Kingdom which prevents the Person-Insured from getting to his departure port or airport in time to catch his flight or sailing.

Sections 3 & 4

- a) childbirth
- b) pregnancy. However this exception shall not apply if pregnancy of the Person-Insured or any person travelling with the Person-Insured commences or is confirmed after the date of issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt and has not continued for more than six months at the date of commencement of the holiday or journey.
- c) any sexually transmitted disease.

Sections 3, 4 & 5

- a) suicide or self-injury wilful self-exposure to peril of the Person-Insured or any person who is travelling with the Person-Insured (except in an attempt to save human life) the influence of drugs (except as prescribed by a registered Medical Practitioner other than for treatment of drug addiction) or alcohol or the Person-Insured engaging in mountaineering racing (other than on foot) or other hazardous adventure during the period of the holiday or journey.
- b) the Person-Insured being in or on entering into or descending from any aircraft other than a fully-licensed passenger carrying aircraft in which the Person-Insured is travelling as a passenger and not for the purpose of undertaking any trade or technical or sporting activities therein or thereon.

Section 6

- a) any liability
 - i) which results from a deliberate act or omission of the Person-Insured and which could reasonably have been expected by the Person-Insured having regard to the nature or circumstances of such act or omission
 - ii) for which indemnity is provided under any other insurance
 - iii) assumed by the Person-Insured by agreement and which would not have attached in the absence of such agreement
- b) any liability caused by or in connection with or arising from
 - i) the ownership or occupation of any land or building or the use thereof by or on behalf of the Person-Insured but this exclusion will not apply to temporary holiday accommodation,
 - ii) any profession or business of the Person-Insured or anything done in connection therewith or for the purpose thereof
 - iii) the ownership or possession or custody or use by or on behalf of the Person-Insured of any motor vehicle aircraft or motorised waterborne craft.

Section 7

- a) any contingency which commenced (or for which an official stated intent had been given) on or prior to the date of issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt or in respect of c) the date of departure from the Person-Insured's home.
- b) any contingency arising from the failure of the Person-Insured to check in at the port or airport according to the itinerary given to him by the Tour Operator or Carrier under a) or b) only.

Sections 1, 4, 6 & 7

- a) loss or destruction of or damage to any property whatsoever or any loss or expense whatsoever resulting or arising therefrom or any consequential loss,
- b) any legal liability of whatsoever nature, directly or indirectly caused by or contributed to by or arising from
 - i) ionising radiations or contamination by radioactivity from any nuclear fuel or from any nuclear waste from the combustion of nuclear fuel,
 - ii) the radioactive toxic explosive or other hazardous properties of any explosive nuclear assembly or nuclear component thereof.

Sections 1(a), 2, 3, 4 & 7(b)

The amount for which the Company shall not be liable under each of the above Sections is limited to a maximum amount of £50 in the aggregate where one occurrence relates to two or more members of the same family insured under this Policy.

An experienced Assistance Co-ordinator will deal with your enquiry and will then ensure that where necessary:

- a) Hospitals will be contacted and any necessary fees guaranteed.
- b) Multi-lingual assistance co-ordinators are in most cases able to converse with doctors and hospitals abroad in their own language.
- c) Medical advisors are consulted at the outset for their views on the possibility of arranging repatriation and the best method for transportation to be adopted. Specially equipped air ambulances are available for critical cases whilst in less serious circumstances scheduled air services will be used. Whenever necessary the patient will be escorted by a medical attendant.
- d) Assistance upon arrival in the United Kingdom will be provided, where medically necessary.
