Booking conditions

This brochure was published in November 1991. Your contract is with H R Richmond Ltd trading as Epsom Tours (ABTA number 52132).

1. Booking All bookings are accepted, and all tickets issued subject to the following conditions. To ensure booking, you must pay a deposit of:

- (i) £30 per person on tours of up to four days duration;
- (ii) £50 per person on tours of five days duration and over (except USA and Canada £100). All monies paid to your travel agent are held by him on our behalf. You will be issued with a confirmation ticket at the time of booking.

2. Balance The balance of the price of your holiday must be paid through the office at which you made your booking at least six weeks before the departure date. If the balance is not paid in time, we reserve the right to cancel your holiday, retain your deposit, and apply cancellation charges as set out below.

3. Changes by you If, after a booking has been confirmed, you wish to change to another of our holidays or change departure date, we will do our utmost to make the changes, provided that written notification is received at our Head Office from the person who made the booking, or from their travel agent, at least six weeks before departure. This must be accompanied by a payment of £10 to cover our administration costs. Any alteration by you within six weeks of departure will be treated as a cancellation of the original booking and will be subject to the cancellation charges set out below.

4. Cancellation by you You, or any member of your party, may cancel your holiday at any time providing that the cancellation is made by the person who made the booking and is communicated to us in writing via the travel agent with whom you made your booking. As this incurs administrative costs, we will retain your deposit and in addition, apply the following cancellation charges:

Note: If the reason for cancellation is covered under the terms of the insurance policy (see pages 38 and 39), you may be able to reclaim these charges.

5. Complaints If you have a problem during your holiday, please inform our representative who will endeavour to put things right quickly. If your complaint cannot be resolved locally, our representative will ask you to complete a report form, the original of which is for you and a copy will be forwarded to our Head Office. Please follow this up within 28 days of your return home by writing to Epsom Tours, Blenheim Road, Epsom, Surrey KT19 9AF giving your booking details and all other relevant information. It is unlikely that you will have a complaint that cannot be settled amicably between us. However, disputes arising out of, or in connection with this contract which cannot be amicably settled, may (if you so wish) be referred to arbitration under a special scheme, which, though devised by arrangement with the Association of British Travel Agents, is administered quite

independently by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. The scheme, details of which can be supplied on request, provides for a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on the customer in respect of costs. The scheme does not apply to claims for an amount greater than £1,500 per person or £7,500 per booking. Neither does it apply to claims which are solely or mainly in respect of physical injury or illness or the consequences of such injury or illness. If you elect to seek redress under this scheme, written notice requesting arbitration must be made within nine months after the scheduled date of return from holiday. Full details are available from the Consumer Affairs Department, Association of British Travel Agents, 55-57 Newman Street, London W1P 4AH (telephone 071 637 2444).

6. Surcharge guarantee The price of your holiday is fully guaranteed and will not be subject to any surcharges. Our prices are based on the following exchange rates published in the Daily Telegraph on 12th July 1991: Austria 20.15, Belgium 59.15, Canada 1.8275, France 9.75, Germany 2.8775, Holland 3.2475, Ireland 1.08, Italy 2.145, Luxembourg 59.15, Switzerland 2.4950 and United States 1.5975.

7. Changes by us It is unlikely we will have to make any changes to your holiday, but we do plan the arrangements many months in advance. Occasionally changes may be made, which we reserve the right to do so at any time. Most of these changes are minor, and we will advise you or your travel agent at the earliest possible date. If a major change becomes necessary, we will inform you or your travel agent as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before departure. A major change is defined as follows:-

- (i) a change of departure date;
- (ii) a significant change of main resort;
- (iii) a change of main hotel to that of a lower category;

When a major change occurs, provided it does not arise from circumstances amounting to force majeure (see below), you will have the choice of either accepting the change of arrangements, purchasing another available holiday from us, or cancelling your holiday. In all cases, we will pay compensation as detailed below:

Important note: Compensation will not be payable if we are forced to cancel, or in any way change your holiday due to war, threat of war, riot, civil strife, industrial dispute, terrorist activity, natural or nuclear disaster, fire or adverse weather conditions.

8. Cancellation by us We reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your holiday. However, in no case will we cancel your holiday less than six weeks before the scheduled departure date except for reasons of force majeure

or failure on your part to pay the final balance. In circumstances where we are unable to provide the holiday booked, we will return to you all monies paid, or offer you an alternative holiday of comparable standard and if a cancellation occurs within six weeks of departure, compensation on a similar scale to that shown in paragraph 7 above.

9. This contract is made on the terms of these booking conditions which are governed by English Law and both parties shall submit to the jurisdiction of the English Courts at all times.

10. In the event of a delay of more than six hours to the advertised times of any of our tours, we will do our best to arrange meals and accommodation as appropriate. Please refer to the insurance policy regarding departure delay.

11. The information in this brochure is published in good faith and believed to be accurate at the time of going to press (August 1991).

Our responsibility on foreign holidays

12. We accept responsibility for ensuring the holiday which you book with us is supplied as described in this brochure and the services offered reach a reasonable standard. If any part is not provided as promised, we will pay you appropriate compensation if this has affected the enjoyment of your holiday. We accept responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of our employees, agents and suppliers save where they lead to death, injury or illness except as provided in Clause 13 below.

13. We accept responsibility for death, injury, or illness caused by the negligent acts and/or omissions of our employees or agents together with our suppliers and sub-contractors whilst acting within the scope of, or in the course of their employment. We will accordingly pay to our clients such damages as might have been claimed in respect of death, illness or injury caused by the negligence, as accepted under English Law, of our employees, agents or suppliers contracted or sub-contracted by us to provide any part of the arrangements for your holiday.

14. If any client suffers death, illness or injury whilst overseas arising out of activity which does not form part of the foreign inclusive holiday arrangement or excursion arranged through us, we shall, at our discretion offer advice, guidance and assistance to help you in resolving any claim you may have against a third party, provided we are advised of the incident within 90 days of the occurrence. Where legal action is contemplated our authority must be obtained prior to the commencement of proceedings and be subject to your undertaking to assign any costs recovered or any benefits received under an appropriate insurance policy to ourselves. Our costs in respect of the above on behalf of you and your party shall not exceed £5,000 in total, other than in respect of legal expenses where we provide cover of up to £50,000 per person.

15. In respect of the services provided by air, sea or land carriers, our liability in all cases shall be limited in the manner provided by international conventions.

16. When you travel with the carrier, the conditions of carriage of that carrier apply, some of which may limit or exclude liability. This brochure is the responsibility of the tour operator, it is not issued on behalf of, and does not commit the airlines mentioned therein or any airline whose services are used in the course of the tour.

General information

1. Children's reductions Subject to their sharing a bedroom with two adults, children under 12 years of age will usually be offered a 20% discount on the tour cost. Our tours are not suitable for children under three years of age.

2. Departure points and times Your choice of departure point must be advised to us at the time of booking. If you decide to depart from another authorised point, you must send us a written notification at least two weeks before departure. Please ensure you are waiting at the correct departure point in plenty of time. We cannot be responsible for any loss or expense suffered by late arrival.

3. Disabled persons If you are disabled or infirm, please advise us at the time of booking. Unfortunately, we are limited in the assistance we can provide.

4. Driver's gratuity The driver's gratuity is not included in the cost of the tour. If you have been happy with his service, it is customary to give him a gratuity according to the level of service received.

5. Fitness to travel Please check with your doctor if in any doubt about your fitness to travel.

6. Foreign currency On overseas tours, we suggest that you take a small amount of currency for each country visited and the main bulk of your money in travellers cheques which are insured against loss and easily converted to cash.

7. Group bookings Groups are allowed one free place in 20.

8. Health requirements For information pertaining to health requirements of countries visited by Epsom Tours, please refer to the DHSS leaflets SA40 and SA41 (Travellers Guide to Health), available from ABTA travel agents or the Department of Health and Social Security. You should also check with your doctor before your departure as to which inoculations the Department of Health consider necessary for specific areas.

9. Hotel classifications and service charges The AA ratings are taken from 1991 guides. Where applicable, hotel service charges are included in the cost of our tours. However, if you have been especially pleased with the service, it is customary to give a gratuity.

10. Insurance Holiday insurance is included in the cost of our tours. Full details of the protection offered by the policy are shown on pages 38 and 39 and you are covered from the time you pay your deposit.

11. Itinerary variations Please note that we reserve the right to vary the order of places visited. It is advisable to check with the driver/courier before arranging to meet friends etc.

12. Late booking If you wish to make a late booking, you will have to pay the usual deposit before we contact the hotel(s). The deposit will be returned, should we be unsuccessful obtaining the accommodation.

13. Lost property All lost property must be claimed and collected within six months from Epsom Coaches, Blenheim Road, Epsom, Surrey KT19 9AF.

14. Luggage Because space is limited, luggage must not exceed one suit case per person plus light hand baggage. The labels provided by the company should be clearly filled in and securely attached to your luggage to avoid misdirection.

15. No smoking It is essential that passengers refrain from smoking in all sections of the coach.

16. Passports and visas We will not be responsible or liable for any delay or expense suffered by passengers whose passports are not in order at the time of travel or who have neglected to deal with health and visa requirements.

17. Pets Pets and other animals are not allowed on our tours (guide dogs excepted, UK mainland only).

18. Radios, tape-players etc In the interest of other passengers, radios, tape-players, musical instruments etc must not be played in the coach.

19. Refreshment stops Convenient stops are made for morning coffee, lunch and afternoon tea which unless specified, are not included in the cost of our tours.

20. Return times By 'average setting down time', we mean in normal conditions at the middle of the setting down route. If you are being met, you are advised to confirm the estimated return time with the driver and telephone from the last stop. There are taxi ranks outside Epsom and Surbiton stations (adjacent to our setting down points). Computer Cab (071 286 0286) offers a 24-hour service.

21. Seat allocation You keep the same seat(s) throughout your tour and since allocations are made on a first come, first served basis, early booking is advisable to give you a better choice. We reserve the right to allocate seats other than those you have booked, although this will be avoided so far as possible.

22. Special requests Although we are pleased to pass on special requests to hotels - eg. low floor or special diet - we cannot guarantee your wishes will be met.

23. Travel documents When you pay your balance, your agent will issue a balance ticket and luggage labels. An information pack will be given to you by your driver/courier when you commence your tour.

24. Unreasonable conduct We can refuse a booking, or terminate a passenger's holiday in the event of unreasonable conduct.

Holiday insurance

For residents of the United Kingdom only (including Channel Islands and Isle of Man). The holiday insurance premium is included in the tour cost and cover applies from the time the deposit is paid.

This policy wording is to confirm that those persons who have paid the required deposit are insured under the Master Policy issued to Epsom Tours by the Municipal General Insurance Limited, Wey House, Farnham Road, Guildford, Surrey GU1 4XS through Accident & General Ltd, Black Lion House, 45 Whitechapel Road, London E1 1DU and sets out in full the terms, exceptions and conditions thereof.

IMPORTANT

Cancellation cover applies as soon as the deposit is paid. The remaining covers apply for the duration of the booked holiday plus the period of travel from home to departure point and back home afterwards not exceeding 24 hours in each case. If the return is unavoidably delayed for an insured reason, cover will be extended free of charge for the period of that delay. Cover applies on land, sea or scheduled or charter flights in the British Isles and the Countries visited during the booked holiday and transit there between.

As the cover under Section 1 commences immediately the holiday booking has been accepted, no refund of premium can be allowed. Kindly note that the amount deductible from each and every claim applies to each Insured Person involved in a claim, as do the sums insured under each Section.

Area 1 Great Britain and Isle of Man

Area 2A Channel Islands

Area 2B Europe and Eire

Area 3 Worldwide

Section 1 - Cancellation

If the Insured Person shall sustain pecuniary loss in respect of irrecoverable deposits and payments for unused travel and accommodation for which the Insured Person contracted prior to the commencement of the holiday as a result of the Insured Person's necessary and unavoidable inability (and not merely disinclination) to commence travel as arranged arising from causes beyond the control of the Insured Person occurring after the premium has been paid then the Company will reimburse such pecuniary loss up to the final invoice cost of the holiday.

The following amount will be deducted from each and every claim £20 (£5 for deposit claims only).

Section 2 - Personal Accident - up to £15,000.

The contingency of bodily injury sustained by the Person-Insured caused solely by violent accidental external and visible means which injury shall independently of any other cause be the sole cause of

occurring within one year of the happening of bodily injury as aforesaid. Notwithstanding the amount shown for a) b) c) above so far as concerns the Person-Insured whose age is under sixteen years or is seventy-six years or over the Sum Insured shall not exceed £1,000 for item a). For the Person-Insured whose age is seventy-six years or over no amount shall be payable for item c).

Section 3 Medical and Other Expenses

The contingency of bodily injury or illness sustained by the Person-Insured which shall be the sole and direct cause of any of the following necessarily incurred expenses payable within six months of the incident giving rise to a claim.

A. (Areas 2A, 2B and 3 only) - up to £500,000

- reasonable medical, surgical, hospital or nursing home or nursing fees or charges or charges for reasonable emergency dental treatment for the alleviation of sudden pain (which shall not include the provision of dentures artificial teeth or any dental work involving the use of precious material) incurred outside the Person-Insured's country of domicile.
- reasonable additional transport and accommodation expenses incurred by or for the Person-Insured and any one other person who is required on medical advice to travel to or remain with the Person-Insured.
- reasonable charges in the event of death for (a) burial or cremation of the Person-Insured in the locality (other than the United Kingdom) where death occurs up to a limit of £1,500 plus the cost of conveyance of the ashes of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom, or (b) conveyance of the body of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom.
- the Person-Insured being confined to hospital as an in-patient during the period of the holiday when the Company will pay £10 for each full day so confined to a maximum of £200 in addition to expenses under A) above.

B. (Area 1 only) - up to £1,000

- reasonable additional board or lodging or similar expenses incurred by the Person-Insured or by a relative or friend remaining with the Person-Insured and the increased cost of return travel of the Person-Insured and reasonable additional travel charges by a relative or friend travelling to or with the Person-Insured up to a limit of £500 in total.
- reasonable charges in the event of death for the cost of conveyance of the body or ashes of the Person-Insured to his place of residence within the United Kingdom, Channel Islands or the Isle of Man up to a limit of £500.

If at any time of any claim, under this Section there shall be any other Insurance or Indemnity covering the same contingency and any part thereof the Company shall not be liable for more than its rateable proportion thereof. The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any expenses incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under this Section.

Incidents that could give rise to a claim in excess of £10,000 must be reported to Mondial Assistance immediately using either of the methods shown here.

Section 4A - Personal Luggage - Areas 1, 2A and 2B - up to £600, Area 3 - up to £1,000.

a) the contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Person-Insured's Luggage comprising suitcases, trunks and their contents and articles worn or carried plus travel tickets all whilst away from the Person-Insured's usual residence.

b) The contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Person-Insured's passport whilst away from, the Person-Insured's usual residence during the Period when an amount will be paid to cover the necessary costs incurred in replacing the passport.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or damage incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under paragraph a) of this Section.

Section 4B - Delayed Baggage

If the Insured Person's baggage is certified by the representative to have been lost or misplaced on the outward journey for at least 24 hours from the time of arrival at the holiday destination then an amount of up to £50 for replacement purchases necessarily made at the time will be paid to the Insured Person which will be refundable to the Insurance Company if the baggage or any part of it proves to be permanently lost.

Section 5 - Personal Money - Areas 1, 2A and 2B - up to £200, Area 3 - up to £300.

The contingency of loss or damage by accident or misfortune to the Personal Money (comprising bank and currency notes, cash, cheques, postal and money orders, current postage stamps and travellers' cheques) held for private purposes of the Person-Insured whilst away from the Person-Insured's usual residence. The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or damage incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under this section.

Section 6 - Personal Liability - up to £1,000,000

The contingency of claims made upon the Person-Insured for

A. all sums which the Person-Insured shall become legally liable to pay for compensation and claimant's costs and expenses in respect of injury illness disease loss or damage.

B. all costs and expenses of litigation incurred with the written consent of the Company in respect of a claim against the Person-Insured for compensation to which the indemnity expressed in this Section applies, in respect of

- bodily injury to or illness or disease of any person not being at the time of sustaining such injury illness or disease, engaged in the service of the Person-Insured
- loss of or damage to property not belonging to nor in the charge nor under the control of the Person-Insured or a member of his family or a person in his service occurring during the period of the holiday or journey.

Section 7 - Departure Delay - benefit after 12 hours and cancellation after 24hrs up to The Final Invoiced Cost of the Holiday.

Geographical Area 1, 2A, 2B & 3.

In the event of the contingency of industrial action, adverse weather conditions, mechanical breakdown or derangement of the coach, sea vessel or aircraft resulting in delayed departure of the Person-Insured's coach journey, sailing or flight for at least 12 hours on the outward or return journey from the time shown in the Carrier's travel itinerary as supplied to the Person-Insured, the Company will pay to the Person-Insured.

a) £20 for the first full 12 hours delay, and £10 for each subsequent full 12 hours delay, of such coach journey, sailing or flight per Person-Insured, but not exceeding a total of £60 per Person-Insured or

b) that proportion of the invoiced cost of the holiday or journey paid (or contracted to be paid) prior to commencement thereof, for the benefit of such Person-Insured only, which is irrecoverable from any other source, consequent upon abandonment of the holiday or journey by the Person-Insured before departure of the outward conveyance from the United Kingdom, but not exceeding in total final Invoice Cost of the holiday. The delay period shall be calculated from the scheduled departure time of the coach, sailing or flight shown in the travel itinerary and in respect of a) coach journeys will apply only at the prime starting point of the outward or return journey. Provided always that (i) the Person-Insured shall have checked-in according to the itinerary given to him by the Tour Operator or Carrier and shall have obtained written confirmation from the Coach Operator, Shipping Line or Air Operator or their Handling Agents that the coach, sailing or flight was delayed by a contingency described in the Section (such confirmation stating the actual period of the delay).

Geographical Areas 2A, 2B and 3 only

c) Provided no claim is made under a) or b) above the Company will pay up to £300 for additional accommodation and transport charges as a result of failure of Public Transport Scheduled

Services to get the Person-Insured to the coach starting point or departure port by the time stated in the itinerary supplied caused by any contingency stated above.

The Company shall not be liable for the first £20 of any loss or charges incurred by each Person-Insured in respect of each occurrence under b) above.

HOW TO MAKE A CLAIM

1 You must retain this document to produce in the event of a claim.

2 You must notify the Police within 24 hours of discovery in the event of loss of money and/or travellers cheques and also in the event of a loss of jewellery or personal effects through burglary or theft. A copy of the Police Report must be obtained.

3 All claims must be made direct and sent with this policy wording to;

CONDITIONS

1. In the event of an occurrence which may give rise to a claim written notice shall be given to the Insurer immediately. All certificates, information and evidence required by the Insurer shall be furnished at the expense of and Insured Person or his/her legal representatives.

2. No person is entitled to admit liability on behalf of the Insurer or to give any representation or other undertaking binding upon them. The Insurer may at its own expense take proceedings in the name of an Insured Person to recover compensation from any Third Party in respect of any indemnity provided under this insurance and any amount so recovered shall belong to the Insurer.

3. In the event of the death of an Insured Person, the Insurer shall have the right to have a post-mortem carried out at its own expense.

4. No refund of premium is allowed once the insurance has been effected.

5. Insured Persons must exercise reasonable care to prevent accident, injury, loss or damage. Failure to do so will prejudice the right to claim under this Policy.

Insured Persons shall take all ordinary and reasonable precautions for the safe-keeping of the property insured under Sections 4 and 5 and take such steps for the recovery of the property as if he/she were not insured.

6. In the event of a fraudulent claim being submitted by an Insured Person or anyone acting on his/her behalf or with whom they are in collusion, all benefits under this policy shall be forfeited.

7. The Construction, validity and performance of this insurance shall be construed in all respects in accordance with United Kingdom jurisdiction.

8. An Insured Person may not transfer his/her interest in this insurance.

9. UK residents only.

EXCLUSIONS - APPLICABLE TO ALL SECTIONS

This insurance does not cover-

- Loss directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through, or in consequence of winter sports.
- Loss directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through or in consequence of war, invasion, acts of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not) civil war, rebellion, revolution insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation or nationalisation or requisition of or destruction of or damage to property by or under the order of any Government or local authority.
- Loss directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through, or in consequence of nuclear fission, nuclear fusion, or radioactive contamination.
- Any claim arising directly or indirectly from any injury, illness, death, loss, expense or other liability attributable to HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) and/or any HIV related illness including AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) and/or variations thereof however caused.
- Loss in respect of any property more specifically insured or any claim which but for the existence of this insurance would be recoverable under any other insurance.
- Incidents which may give rise to a claim not notified direct in writing to the Insurer or its claim settling agents within 31 days of the expiry of this insurance.
- Claims increased by an Insured Person's own act or omission.
- Claims arising as a result of an Insured Person engaging in professional sports and/or rugby league or union.

Section 1 only - Loss of Deposit or Cancellation

This insurance does not cover-

- The first £20 of each and every claim (except for claims for Loss of Deposit only).
- (a) Government regulations (other than in respect of compulsory quarantine) or currency restriction or act.
- (b) Omission or default of provider of transport or accommodation or of an agent through whom the travel arrangements were made.
- (c) Disinclination to travel.
- (d) Financial circumstances of any Insured Person (arising from other than loss of his/her employment due to redundancy qualifying for payment under current redundancy payment legislation).
- (e) Strikes or labour disputes.
- (f) Expenses payable by the Tour Operator, Hotel or Airline.
- (g) Delay in commencement of holiday.
- (h) Surcharges levied by the Tour Operator.
3. Directly or indirectly arising from failure to notify travel agent, Tour Operator or provider of transport or accommodation immediately it is found necessary to cancel the travel arrangements.

Section 2 & 3 - Personal Accident, Medical and other Expenses, Hospital Insurance Benefit and Curtailment

This insurance does not cover-

- Losses arising from accidents on two-wheeled vehicles of over 250cc as passenger or driver.
- Treatment or aid obtained in the United Kingdom (other than as provided under section 3) or medical expenses recovered under a reciprocal health agreement.
- Surgery or medical treatment which in the opinion of the medical practitioner treating an Insured Person can be reasonably delayed until that Insured Person's return to the United Kingdom.
- Medication which at the time of departure is known to be required or to be continued outside the United Kingdom.
- The additional cost of single or private room accommodation at a hospital or nursing home except where the medical practitioner treating an Insured Person deems it necessary for that Insured Person to occupy such accommodation.
- Loss directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through or in consequence of accidents whilst engaged in racing, motor rallies and competitions, hang gliding, mountaineering (reasonably requiring the use of ropes or guides), pot-holing, underwater activities requiring the use of artificial breathing apparatus or aerial activities or aviation (other than as a fare-paying passenger in a duly certified multi-engineered passenger-carrying aircraft flown in the course of licensed operations for the transportation of passengers by air by a properly licensed crew).
- Loss directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through or in consequence of suicide or wilfully self-inflicted injury or illness, insanity, venereal disease, being under the influence of the alcohol or drugs (other than drugs taken in accordance with treatment prescribed and directed by a registered medical practitioner, but not for the treatment of drug addiction), self exposure to needless peril (except in an attempt to save human life).

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Section 4a

This insurance does not cover:-

- loss of or damage to watches, jewellery, furs, precious metal, precious stones or articles composed of any of them, photographic apparatus, binoculars, audio and video equipment for more than £150 in respect of the whole of such property for each Person-Insured.
- damage or deterioration occasioned by atmospheric or climatic conditions of wear and tear or depreciation.
- breakage of or damage to fragile articles, audio and video equipment, musical instruments, sculpture, household goods or equipment unless occasioned by fire or accident to the conveyance in which the Person-Insured's Luggage is being carried.
- loss or damage to contact the corneal lenses, bonds, coupons, stamps, negotiable instruments, securities or documents of any kind and Personal Money.
- more than £200 in respect of any single article of any kind.
- damage to perishable goods or bottles or any subsequent damage caused as a result thereof.
- loss or damage to pedal cycles other than whilst being conveyed by Public Transport.
- loss or damage to property more specifically insured elsewhere.
- Property stolen from an unattended vehicle unless it was in the locked boot of the vehicle and evidence of forcible entry to the boot is available or any property stolen from a vehicle overnight (ie between 9pm and 9am).

Section 4b

Mechanical breakdown or derangement, breakage of fragile or brittle articles unless caused by fire or by accident to a vessel, aircraft or vehicle.

Section 4 & 5

This insurance does not cover:-

- loss or damage to property left unattended whilst away from the Person-Insured's personal accommodation.
- any claim for loss of property not accompanied by a report from the local Police or from the Carriers when loss has occurred in transit.
- loss or damage arising from strike, delay, confiscation, detention,

requisition or destruction by Customs or other Officials or Authorities.
 d) Depreciation in value or shortage due to error or omission.

Section 6

This insurance does not cover:-

- Any liability
 - which results from a deliberate act or omission of the Person-Insured and which could reasonably have been expected by the Person-Insured having regard to the nature or circumstances of such act or omission.
 - for which indemnity is provided under any other insurance.
 - assumed by the Person-Insured by agreement and which would not have attached in the absence of such agreement.
- Any liability caused by or in connection with or arising from
 - the ownership or occupation of any land or building or the use thereof by or on behalf of the Person Insured but this exclusion will not apply to temporary holiday accommodation.
 - any profession or business of the Person-Insured or anything done in connection therewith or for the purpose thereof
 - the ownership or possession or custody or use by or on behalf of the Person-Insured of any motor vehicle, aircraft or motorised waterborne craft.

Section 7

This insurance does not cover:-

- any contingency which commenced (or for which an official stated intent had been given) on or prior to the date of issue of the Confirmation and Deposit Receipt or in respect of c) the date of departure from the Person-Insured's home.
- any contingency arising from the failure of the Person Insured to arrive at the departure point according to the itinerary given to him by the Tour Operator or Carrier under a) or b) only.

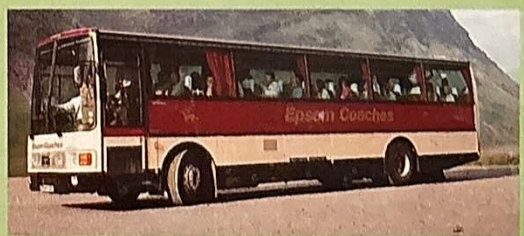
